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# INTRODUCTION

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The One-Boat Network allows you to communicate with and control your Minn Kota and Humminbird compatible products. The One-Boat Network App® is a free iOS and Android application that you can download to a mobile device (smartphone, tablet computer, etc.), providing you with unparalleled control over all of your One-Boat Network connected products. Using **Bluetooth®** wireless technology, you can control your trolling motor and shallow water anchor[s], access 10,000+ Humminbird CoastMaster and LakeMaster vector charts with a VX Chart subscription, as well as create, save and navigate waypoints, routes and tracks. The One-Boat Network App also lets you update system software from your mobile device to your Humminbird and Minn Kota products and receive real-time technical support with our innovative Request A Call Back feature.

## 2 | Download the One-Boat Network Mobile App



1. **Apple iOS:** Open the App Store.  
**Google Android:** Open the Play Store.
2. Search the app store for One-Boat Network.
3. Download the One-Boat Network app to your device.
4. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the app download.


## 3 | Update Your Fish Finder Software

To enable all One-Boat Network features, you will need the most up-to-date software on your Humminbird fish finder. See your fish finder operations manual for additional information about updating software.


**Compatibility:** Visit our Web site at [humminbird.com](http://humminbird.com) for the latest list of compatible models.

**Supplies:** In addition to your Humminbird equipment, you will need a computer with Internet access and a formatted 32GB SD or microSD card.

1. Before the fish finder software is updated or restored to system defaults, export your navigation data and copy your screen snapshots to an SD or microSD card. See your fish finder operations manual for instructions.

 **NOTE:** Humminbird is not responsible for the loss of data files [waypoints, routes, tracks, groups, snapshots, recordings, etc.] that may occur due to direct or indirect damage to the unit's hardware or software. It is important to back up your computer and fish finder data files periodically.

2. Install a formatted SD or microSD card into the computer card slot.

 **NOTE:** Do not use an SD or microSD card that is either more or less than 32 GB.

3. Go to [humminbird.com](http://humminbird.com), and click **Support > Software Updates**.
4. Click on your fish finder series. The available models are listed under each series.
5. Click on the link for your unit model. This will take you to the software update page.

- Read the notices and instructions, and select the **Download** link at the bottom of the screen.
  - Follow the on-screen prompts to save the software file to the SD or microSD card.
6. Power on your Humminbird fish finder. Start Normal mode.
  7. Insert the SD or microSD card [with the software file] into the fish finder card slot.




**NOTE:** When you install the SD or microSD card with the software file into your fish finder, the unit will detect the update and provide an automatic prompt to install the software. You can follow the prompts or choose to install the software at a later time. See your fish finder operations manual for more information.

8. Follow the on-screen prompts to update the fish finder software.
9. When the software update is complete, remove the SD or microSD card from the fish finder card slot.
10. **Restart:** If you don't have any other software updates to install, power off the fish finder, and restart it.

# GETTING STARTED

Confirm you have read the setup instructions in the previous section *Preparation*. Use the following sections to get started using the One-Boat Network App. Refer to the instructions for your mobile device operating system: Apple iOS or Google Android.

## Sign In

When you first open the One-Boat Network App, it will ask you to create an account, or sign in with an existing One-Boat Network or ChartSelect ID.

### Launching App (Apple iOS Phone)



### Sign In With an Existing Account

Sign in to One-Boat Network using an existing One-Boat Network or ChartSelect ID.

1. Tap Sign In from the One-Boat Network Launch screen.
2. Use the on-screen keyboard to type in your email address and password.
3. Tap Sign In.



## Create an Account

If you do not already have a One-Boat Network or ChartSelect ID, you can create an account directly from the One-Boat Network App.


1. Tap Create Account from the One-Boat Network Launch screen.
2. Use the on-screen keyboard to type in your account credentials.
3. Tap Create Account.

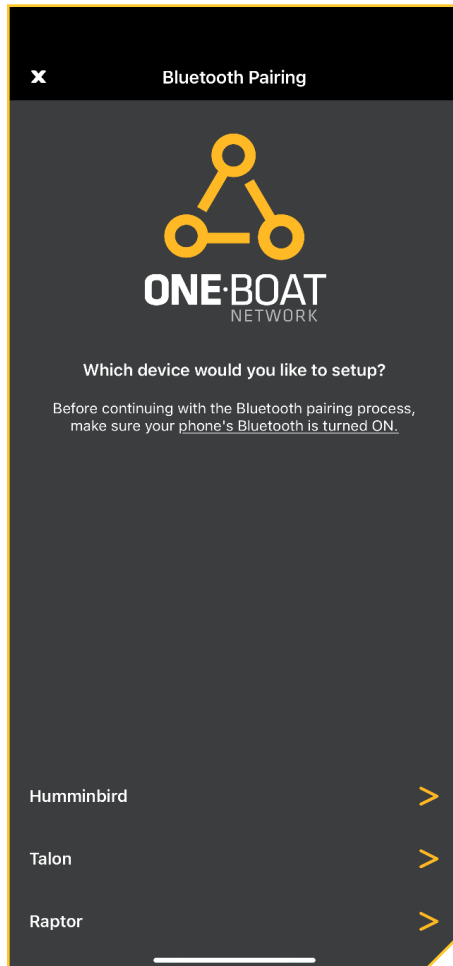

## Pair Devices

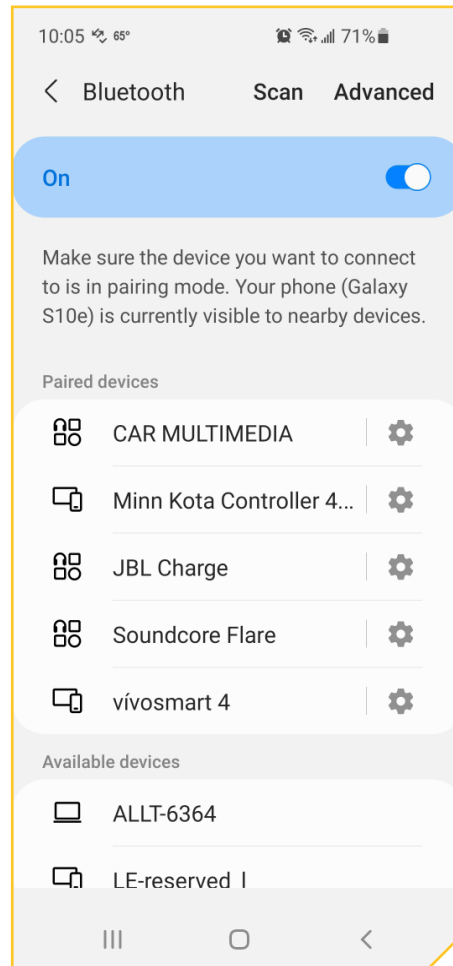
Once you have signed in to the One-Boat Network App, the app will walk you through connecting your mobile device to your Humminbird and Minn Kota devices. You can choose to skip this step and come back to it later. To return to the Bluetooth Pairing menu, select Self Help ⓘ from the Home screen and then select Bluetooth Pairing ✖.

Each connected device must be paired separately.

### 1. Enable Bluetooth on the Mobile Device

1. Open the Settings menu.
2. Select Bluetooth.
3. Select On.
4. Keep the Bluetooth menu open and proceed to the next procedure.

## 2. Pair the Mobile Device to a Humminbird Fish Finder

### APEX/SOLIX Series

1. Press the HOME key.
2. Select the Bluetooth tool.
3. Select Connect Phone under Phone Bluetooth Settings to make your Humminbird unit discoverable by your mobile device.
4. Navigate to the Bluetooth Settings on your mobile device.
5. Select your Humminbird model name under Other Devices [iOS] or Available Devices [Android].
6. When prompted, tap Pair on your phone.

Once your Humminbird unit is paired with your device, the Humminbird model name will display under My Devices in the iOS Bluetooth settings or Paired Devices in the Android Bluetooth settings.


7. In your phone settings menu, turn on Show Notifications [iOS only].

### HELIX G2N Series or Newer

1. **Main Menu:** Press the MENU key twice.
2. **Open the Phone Bluetooth Menu:** Select the Accessories tab.
3. Select Phone Bluetooth. Press the RIGHT Cursor key.
4. Select Connect New Phone. Press the RIGHT Cursor key.  
It will take a moment for this option to appear in the menu.
5. Follow the on-screen prompts to start the pairing process.
6. When the phone name displays in the menu, select it. Press the RIGHT Cursor key.
7. Check your phone. When prompted, tap Pair on your phone.
8. In your phone Settings menu, turn on Show Notifications.


## 3. Pair the Mobile Device to a Trolling Motor

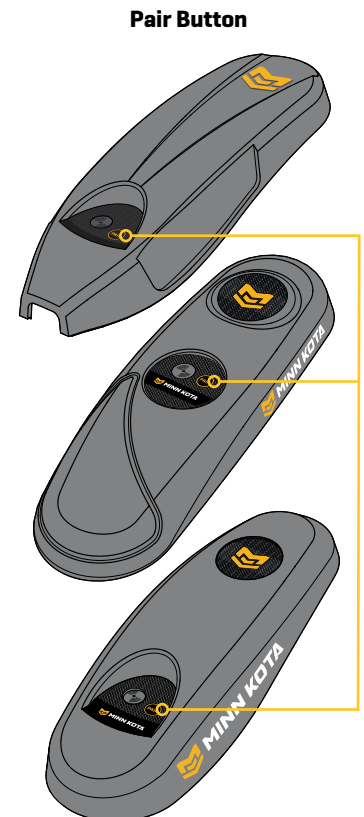
1. **Enable Pairing Mode on the Trolling Motor:** Press and hold the Pair PAIR button on the trolling motor Control Head. The trolling motor will emit a continuous tone while in Pairing Mode.
2. Navigate to the Bluetooth Settings on your mobile device.
3. Select "Minn Kota Controller 4.0" under the Bluetooth Device List. It may take a moment for the trolling motor to appear in the menu. Continue to hold the Pair button during this process.

 **NOTE:** Android devices must press Scan to locate the device in the Bluetooth list.

4. The trolling motor will emit 3 beeps when the pairing is successfully completed and you may release the Pair button.

If 30 seconds pass while in Pairing Mode and they do not successfully pair, an error tone will sound from the trolling motor Control Head, signaling that the pairing has timed out. If unsuccessful, repeat the process.

 **NOTE:** In order for the device and your trolling motor to stay connected, Bluetooth needs to remain "on." When the trolling motor is paired to the device and communicating with it, the One-Boat Network App will automatically recognize that the trolling motor is paired.



## 4. Pair the Mobile Device to a Shallow Water Anchor

### Single Talon

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#### Apple iOS

1. **Enable Pairing Mode on the Talon:** Press and hold the Up and Down buttons on the Talon for two seconds. The depth lights will illuminate in a blue pattern to indicate pairing mode is active.
2. Navigate to the Bluetooth Settings on your mobile device.
3. Select BT Talon under the Other Devices. It may take a moment for the Talon to appear in the menu.

Once your Talon is paired with your device, BT Talon will display under My Devices in the iOS Bluetooth settings.

#### Google Android

1. **Enable Pairing Mode on the Talon:** Press and hold the Up and Down buttons on the Talon for two seconds. The depth lights will illuminate in a blue pattern to indicate pairing mode is active.
2. Navigate to the Bluetooth Settings on your mobile device. Select the Scan button to begin the search for your device.
3. Select BT Talon under Available devices. It may take a moment for the Talon to appear in the menu.

Once your Talon is paired with your device, BT Talon will display under Paired devices in the Android Bluetooth Settings.

### Dual Talons

---

If you are connecting dual Talons, the Talons must be paired together before connecting them to your mobile device. Use the following instructions to pair the Talons together, then follow the instructions for the single Talon to pair it to your mobile device.

1. **Place one Talon in Pairing Mode:** Press and hold the Up and Down buttons on the Talon for two seconds. The depth lights will illuminate in a blue pattern to indicate pairing mode is active.
2. **Place second Talon in Pairing Mode:** Press and hold the Up and Down buttons on the Talon for two seconds. The depth lights will illuminate in a blue pattern to indicate pairing mode is active.
3. Both Talons will beep three times once they are connected, and then both Talon mode lights will flash green.
4. On the starboard Talon, press the Up button to set that Talon as starboard. The starboard Talon's mode light will temporarily illuminate green and the port Talon's mode light will illuminate red to indicate that the Talon positions are set.

### Single Raptor

---

1. **Enable Pairing Mode on the Raptor:** Press the Pair button on the Raptor. The Raptor will illuminate a blue light to indicate pair mode is active.
2. Navigate to the Bluetooth Settings on your mobile device.
3. Select BT Raptor under the Other Devices. It may take a moment for the Raptor to appear in the menu.

Once your Raptor is paired with your device, BT Raptor will display under My Devices in the iOS Bluetooth settings.

### Dual Raptors

---

If you are connecting dual Raptors, the Raptors must be paired together before connecting them to your mobile device. Use the following instructions to pair the Raptors together, then follow the instructions for the single Raptor to pair it to your mobile device.

1. **Place one Raptor in Pairing Mode:** Press the Pair button on the Raptor. The blue pair light will illuminate to indicate pair mode is active.
2. **Place second Raptor in Pairing Mode:** Press the Pair button on the second Raptor. The blue pair light will illuminate to indicate pair mode is active.
3. Both Raptors will beep three times once they are connected, and then both Raptor mode lights will flash green.
4. On the starboard Raptor, press the Up button to set that Raptor as starboard. The starboard Raptor's mode light will temporarily illuminate green and the port Raptor's mode light will illuminate red to indicate that the Raptor positions are set.

## 5. Forgetting a Device

Once a Minn Kota or Humminbird device is paired to your mobile device, it will remember the device, even if they are not actively communicating. In some cases, it may be necessary to clear the memory of the unit on your mobile device.

### Apple iOS

1. Open the Settings menu.
2. Select Bluetooth.
3. Select the "i" icon next to the device in the list of My Devices.
4. Select the option to Forget This Device.

### Google Android

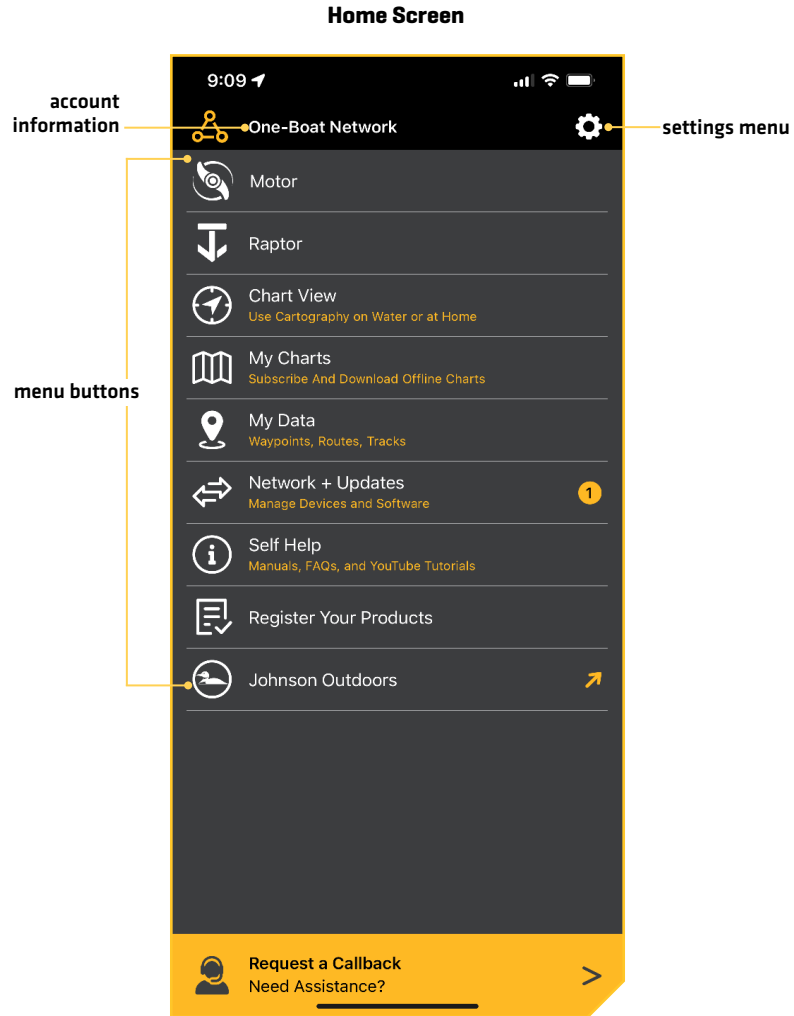
1. Open the Settings menu.
2. Select Bluetooth.
3. Select the Settings icon next to the device in the list of Paired Devices.
4. Select the option to Unpair.

You can also clear the memory from the One-Boat Network App.










1. Tap Network + Updates from the Home screen.
2. Find the device you want to remove from the app.
3. Tap the More Options menu, and select Remove from One-Boat App.

## One-Boat Network Home Screen

The One-Boat Network App opens to display the Home screen.




1. Tap one of the following icons to open a One-Boat Network App:

Menu Icon	Icon Description
	<b>Motor:</b> Display the motor app, which allows you to control your trolling motor from your paired mobile device.
	<b>Anchor:</b> Display the Talon or Raptor app, which includes quick access menus to deploy and retract the anchor and change the anchor mode.
	<b>Chart View:</b> Display high-definition lake maps. Customize depth highlight, shallow water highlight, water level offset, and more. Use GPS-enabled navigation for location, speed, and course on water.
	<b>My Charts:</b> Subscribe to get access to 10,000+ USA and Canada lake and coastal charts. These include high detail contour lines, aerial imagery, shaded relief and bottom hardness.
	<b>My Data:</b> Manage your waypoints, routes, and tracks. Import and export your navigation data.
	<b>Network + Updates:</b> Pair your mobile device to your Bluetooth-enabled Humminbird fish finder so that you can download Humminbird software updates.
	<b>Self Help:</b> Access product manuals, install guides, and FAQs.
	<b>Register Your Products:</b> Register your Minn Kota and Humminbird products to receive the latest Minn Kota and Humminbird news, including accessory compatibility and software update information.

## Review Settings

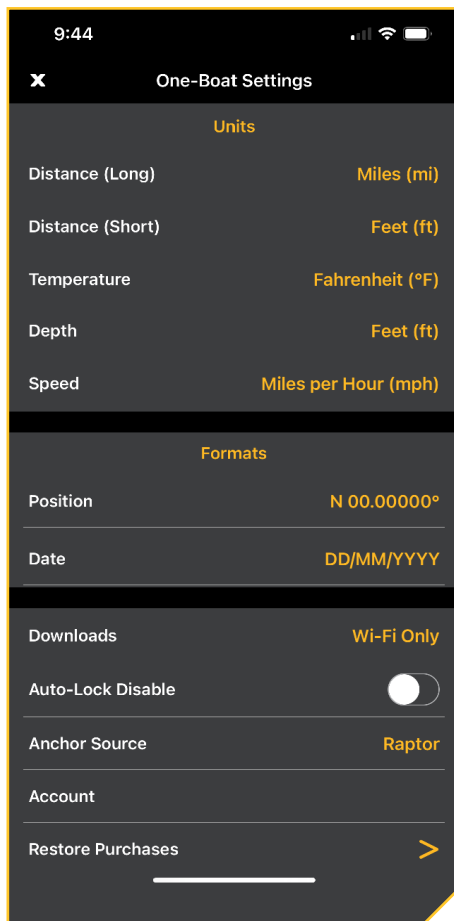
Use the Settings menu on the Main Menu to set default units of measurement, disable auto-lock, restore purchases, and send diagnostic information.

1. Tap the Settings  icon under the One-Boat Network banner at the top right of the app.
2. Select one of the following settings to change.

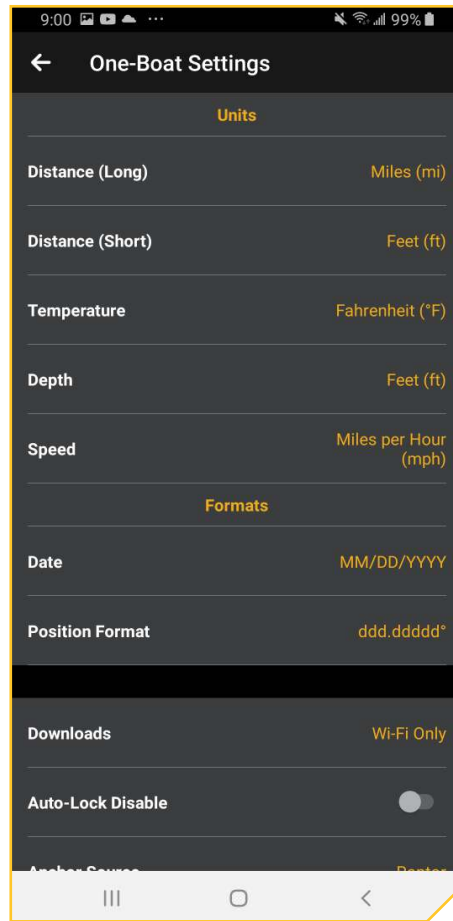
Menu Setting	Description
Distance (Long/Short)	Select the unit of measure for all distance-related readouts. For Distance Long, select Miles [mi], Kilometers [km], or Nautical Miles [nm]. For Distance Short, select Feet [ft] or Meters [m].
Temperature Unit	Select the unit of measure for all temperature-related readouts. Select Fahrenheit [°F] or Celsius [°C].
Depth Unit	Select the unit of measure for all depth-related readouts. Select Feet [ft] or Meters [m].
Speed Unit	Select the unit of measure for all speed-related readouts. Select Miles per Hour [mph] or Kilometers per Hour [km/h].
Position Format	Select the format of the latitude and longitude position display: ddd°mm'ss.s", ddd°mm.mmm', or ddd.dddd°.
Date Format	Select the date format: DD/MM/YYYY, MM/DD/YYYY, or YYYY/MM/DD.
Downloads	Select Wi-Fi Only or Wi-Fi And Cellular to set your download preference.
Auto-Lock Disable	Enable or disable auto-lock on your mobile device screen. The default is Off, which means your device will engage its auto-lock feature. When Auto-Lock Disable is turned On, it will prevent your mobile device from automatically locking and turning off the display after a set elapsed time.
Anchor Source	Select Raptor or Talon as the shallow water anchor.
Account	Manage your account information.
Restore Purchases (iOS Only)	Use this feature if you need to restore previous purchases from your account because you have deleted the app or moved to a new device.
Send Diagnostics	Use this feature to send diagnostic information about your device when you are having technical problems.
About One-Boat Network	Select to view the application software version.
Terms of Use	Select to review the Terms of Use license agreement.

## Touch Screen Overview

A summary of the mobile device touch screen actions are shown here.

 **NOTE:** Some of the information and instructions may not apply to all mobile devices. Refer to the instructions included with your mobile device.



### Tap or Press and Hold

**Select a Menu or Icon:** Tap the selection once.

**Mark a Waypoint or Start a Route:** Press and hold a position on the view to mark a waypoint or start a new route.

**Zoom In:** Tap the screen twice with one finger.

**Zoom Out:** Tap the screen once with two fingers.

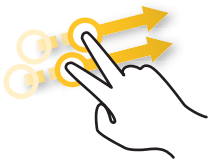
**Share or Delete a Saved Item [Google Android only]:** Press and hold a saved waypoint, route, track, or chart to select the item to export or delete.



### Pinch In/Out

**Zoom In:** Touch the screen with two fingers and move them apart.

**Zoom Out:** Touch the screen with two fingers and move them closer together.



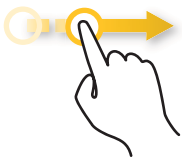
### Swipe Side to Side

**Pan:** Drag one or two fingers across the screen to see more of the chart that is displayed off-screen.



### One Finger Swipe (Up or Down)

**Browse Menus:** Swipe with one finger to scroll through a menu list (up or down).



### One Finger Swipe (Left or Right)

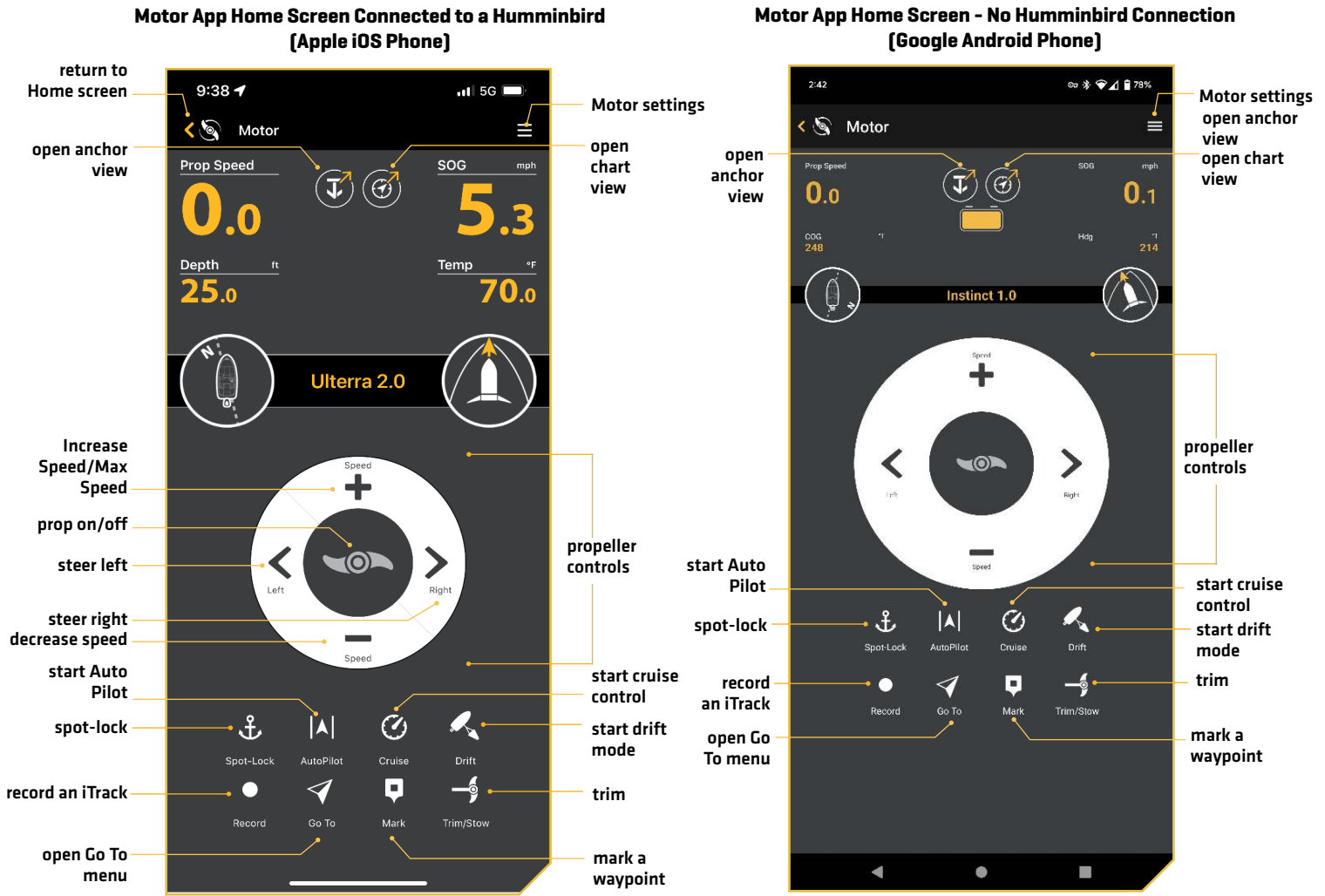
**Select a Slider Bar Setting:** Press and hold on the slider bar circle and drag it left or right to adjust the setting.

**Pan:** Drag one or two fingers across the screen to see more of the chart that is displayed off-screen.

**Delete a Saved Item [Apple iOS only]:** Select a waypoint, route, track, or saved chart in the menu system and swipe left. Tap Delete.

# TROLLING MOTOR

The One-Boat Network mobile app allows you to operate the trolling motor from your paired mobile device. The Trolling Motor App is dynamic and will change depending on which motor you have connected.



The following informational data is displayed on the Motor View.

<b>What's on the Display</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Prop Speed</b>	Displays the current Prop Speed, which can be adjusted in 1/2 speed increments between 0 and 10.
<b>Speed Over Ground (SOG)</b>	Displays the current speed over ground.
<b>Depth</b>	Displays the current water depth based on communication with the Humminbird control head.
<b>Temperature</b>	Displays the current water temperature based on communication with the Humminbird control head.
<b>Navigational Data Bar</b>	Displays dynamic navigation graphics, depending on which navigation method is in use. The left graphic displays the boat heading up, or when in navigation mode, it displays the navigational course line. The right graphic displays the orientation of the motor in relation to the keel.
<b>Battery *</b>	Displays the estimated motor battery life when the prop is disengaged.

Become familiar with the interactive buttons on the Motor App. You can use these buttons to view different parts of the One-Boat Network App and to navigate your motor.

<b>App Buttons</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Home Screen</b>	Return to the Home Screen with all of the One-Boat Network applications.
<b>Motor Settings Menu</b>	Tap to adjust a motor or navigation setting.
<b>Raptor/Talon</b>	Tap to navigate to the Raptor/Talon One-Boat Network App.
<b>Chart View</b>	Tap to navigate to the Chart View on the One-Boat Network App.
<b>Propeller Controls</b>	
<b>Prop On/Off</b>	Tap to turn the prop on and off. It will rotate when the prop is on and the speed is greater than zero. The icon will blink when a mode of navigation is used that requires the prop to be enabled.
<b>Increase/Decrease Speed</b>	Tap to increase or decrease motor speed. Tap and hold increase speed to enable Max Speed. With Max Speed engaged, tap and hold increase speed will resume previous prop speed. Buttons change appearance when Spot-Lock is engaged and Spot-Lock Jog is available. When Spot-Lock Jog is enabled, these buttons function to jog the boat either forward or backward. [A heading sensor is required for Spot-Lock Jog.]

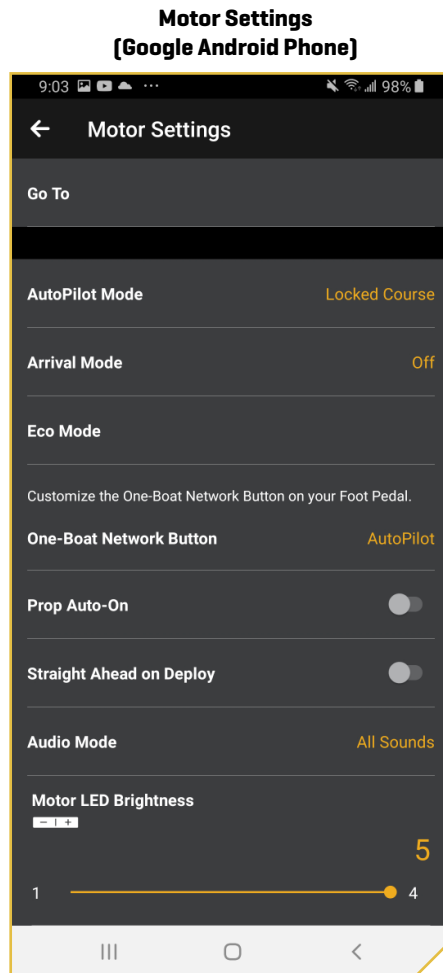

App Buttons	Description
<b>Steer Left/Steer Right</b>	<p>Tap to steer the motor to the left or right.</p> <p>When Spot-Lock Jog enabled, these buttons function to jog the boat either left or right. [A heading sensor is required for Spot-Lock Jog.]</p> <p>When Dodge Mode is enabled, these buttons function to dodge the boat either left or right. If Dodge Mode is turned off, these buttons change the desired heading.</p>
<b>Navigation Controls</b>	
<b>Spot-Lock</b>	Tap to create and start navigation to a temporary Spot-Lock position. The Spot-Lock will be recorded temporarily until you tap Save.
<b>Auto Pilot</b>	Tap to start navigation in the direction of the boat's Course Over Ground [COG] setting.
<b>Cruise Control</b>	Tap the enable or disable cruise control. Once cruise control is enabled, tapping the Increase Speed or Decrease Speed buttons will change the target speed rather than the propeller speed.
<b>Drift Mode</b>	Tap to engage Drift Mode. Drift Mode enables your trolling motor to resist currents and maintain a slower speed.
<b>Record</b>	Tap to start recording an iTrack.
<b>Go To</b>	Tap to start one of the following navigation modes: Spot-Lock, AutoPilot, or Drift.
<b>Mark</b>	Tap to mark a waypoint.

## Change Motor Settings

Use the following instructions to customize the motor and navigation settings.

1. Tap the Menu ☰ icon in the top, right corner.
2. Select a menu option. Press and drag the slider, or tap the plus [+] or minus [-] signs, to adjust the setting.

AutoPilot Mode	Tap to select the AutoPilot mode: Locked Heading or Locked Course. <b>Locked Heading</b> uses an internal compass to provide a heading lock. If a manual steering correction is made, this mode locks onto the new compass heading to which the boat was steered. <b>Locked Course</b> not only uses compass heading but also GPS data to correct for cross winds, current and other external forces to keep the boat on the intended course. ## Adjust Boat Scale

Trolling motor performance can be impacted by factors including, but not limited to, wind, water conditions, boat specifications, battery health, wiring, etc. Boat Scale provides a method of adjusting how the trolling motor will perform to account for these and other variables. The Minn Kota trolling motor comes from the factory with Boat Scale set to zero. This can be adjusted either up [+2] or down [-2] to increase or decrease the way the motor control software will apply power while using a navigation mode like Spot Lock.

An example of needing to reduce Boat Scale would be when the motor is over correcting or making many frequent adjustments while using Spot-Lock. In this case, try reducing Boat Scale -1 to reduce this behavior. If the behavior continues, reduce Boat Scale to -2. The opposite of this would be while using Spot-Lock, the motor is drifting away from its target location frequently or is struggling to make corrections. In this case, try increasing Boat Scale to +1 to help improve the motor's accuracy. If the behavior continues, increase Boat Scale to +2.

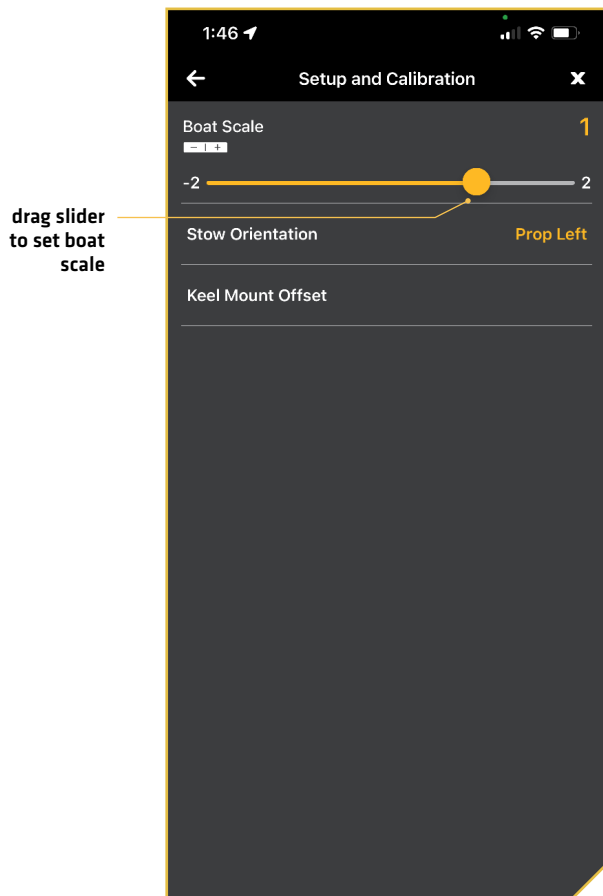
1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner to open Motor Settings.
3. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
4. In Setup and Calibration, use the slider under Boat Scale to adjust the Boat Scale from -2 to +2.

## Set the Heading Sensor Calibration



This function is only performed on motors with an external Heading Sensor. The process of calibrating the Heading Sensor must occur while your boat is on the water. Heading Sensor Calibration should always be performed after the trolling motor and Heading Sensor have been mounted, but before the Heading Sensor Offset is performed. The Heading Sensor must be connected to power and paired with the Control Head of the trolling motor before beginning this process. The calibration process requires the boat to be driven in two complete circles, so plan accordingly when preparing for this process.

1. Power up the trolling motor according to the instructions provided in the Owner's Manual. Make sure the Heading Sensor is powered up and paired with the trolling motor.
2. From the OBN App Home Screen, tap Motor to access the Motor view.
3. Tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner to open Motor Settings.
4. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
5. In Setup and Calibration, find and tap Calibrate Heading Sensor.
6. Review all safety warnings. Tap Start to begin the process.
7. Drive the boat in two complete circles. The center of the app screen contains a counter that shows the progress.
8. The progress of the boat around the circular path will show as a percentage completed for each circle while the boat navigates.
9. Once the two circles are complete, the app screen will read "Calibration Successful. Please perform Sensor Offset."
10. Tap Start Sensor Offset to begin or tap to close the Sensor Calibration and return to the home screen.





## Set the Heading Offset

With the Heading Sensor calibrated, set the Heading Offset. Heading Offset is the difference between the angle of the Keel of the boat and the angle at which the Heading Sensor is mounted to the deck of the boat. During installation, the Heading Sensor was installed to be as parallel to the Keel of the boat as possible. If the boat and Heading Sensor are perfectly parallel and pointing in exactly the same direction, the Offset will be a perfect 0° degrees. Knowing that installations are never perfect, the Heading Offset can be set on the One-Boat Network App to compensate for the difference between the two.

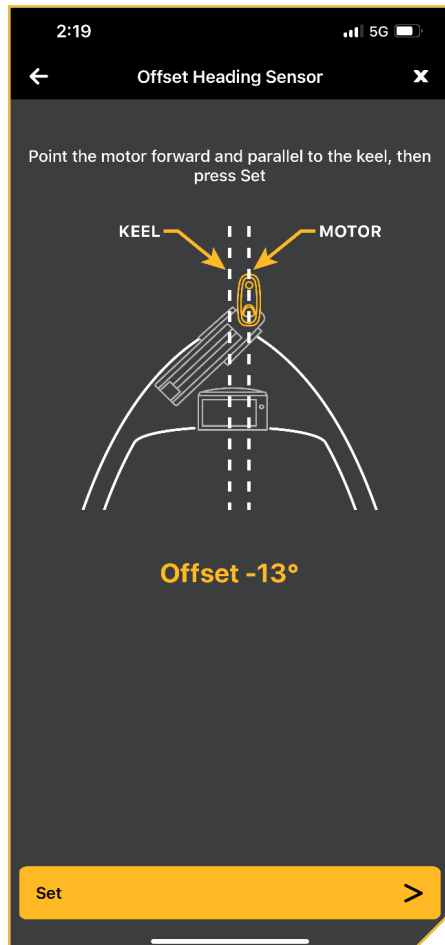
1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner to open Motor Settings.
3. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
4. In Setup and Calibration, find and tap Offset Heading Sensor.
5. Review all safety warnings. If the placement of the trolling motor is pointing forward and parallel to the keel, tap Set. The degree of Heading Sensor Offset shows at the bottom of the app Display.
6. If the trolling motor needs to be adjusted, locate the Return button on the top-left corner of the app screen. Tap the Return button three times until the Motor App home screen displays.
7. Use the Steer Right and Steer Left buttons to point the motor forward and parallel to the keel.
8. When satisfied with the placement of the trolling motor, locate the Menu  icon in the top-right corner and tap it.
9. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
10. In Setup and Calibration, find and tap Offset Heading Sensor. If the placement of the trolling motor is pointing forward and parallel to the keel, tap Set.
11. The degree of Heading Sensor Offset shows at the bottom of the app Display. Tap Return to close the Heading Sensor Offset and return to the home screen.

## Set the Keel Mount Offset

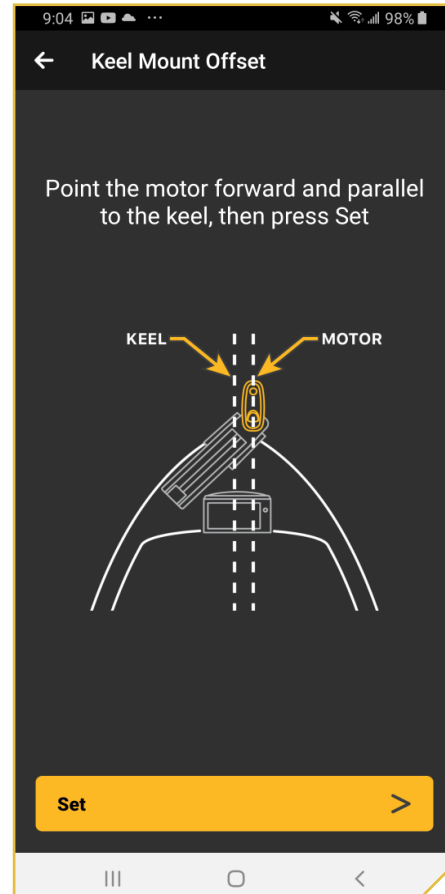
The Keel Mount Offset adjusts the position of the motor in relation to the Keel. This function is only performed on QUEST series motors.

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner to open Motor Settings.
3. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
4. In Setup and Calibration, find and tap Keel Mount Offset.
5. Review all safety warnings. If the placement of the trolling motor is pointing forward and parallel to the keel, tap Set. The degree of the Keel Mount Offset shows at the bottom of the app Display.
6. If the trolling motor needs to be adjusted, locate the Return button on the top-left corner of the app screen. Tap the Return button three times until the Motor App home screen displays.
7. Use the Steer Right and Steer Left buttons to point the motor forward and parallel to the keel.
8. When satisfied with the placement of the trolling motor, locate the Menu  icon in the top-right corner and tap it.
9. In the Motor Settings menu, find and tap Setup and Calibration.
10. In Setup and Calibration, find and tap Keel Mount Offset. If the placement of the trolling motor is pointing forward and parallel to the keel, tap Set.
11. The degree of the Keel Mount Offset shows at the bottom of the app Display. Tap Return to close the Keel Mount Offset and return to the home screen.

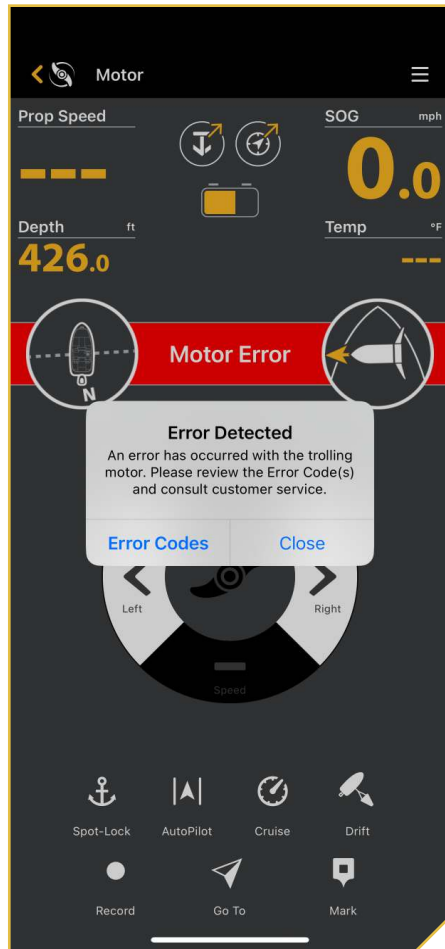

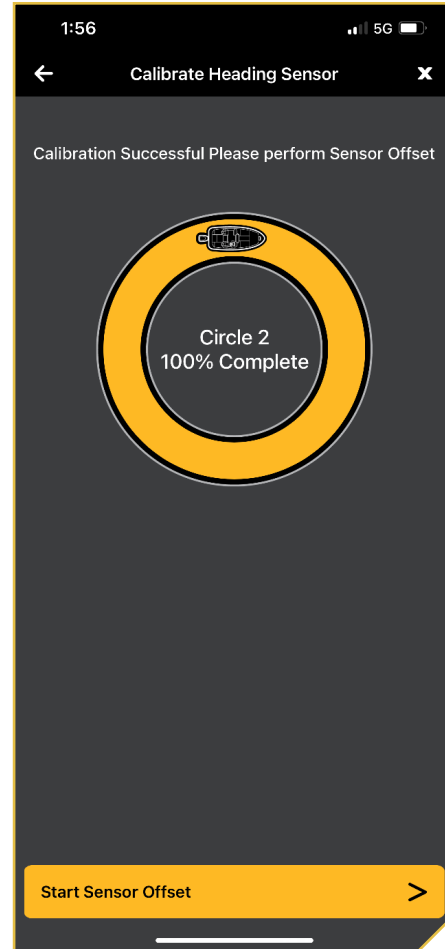

## Spot-Lock

Spot-Lock uses a single point as a reference for the spot you want to stay on. The reference point is a set of GPS coordinates that are captured at the location of the motor at the moment the Spot-Lock is saved. This point is recorded and saved into one of the Spot-Lock memory locations.

Spot-Lock works by recognizing the GPS coordinates and will automatically navigate the boat to keep it at the Spot-Lock location. If the Advanced GPS Navigation system sees the motor is not positioned at the Spot-Lock location, it will control motor speed and direction in an attempt to keep the motor on the Spot-Lock location.

Spot-Lock is based on the location of the motor, not the location or direction of the boat. Outside forces such as wind and current will cause the boat to move. Spot-Lock will navigate to maintain the motor on the Spot-Lock location regardless of the position of the boat.

**WARNING!** Watch for a turning propeller and be prepared for boat movement when working with Spot-Locks. The propeller will automatically turn on when a Spot-Lock is engaged, even if the engagement is accidental. A turning propeller can cause injury. The propeller will turn on for Spot-Locks regardless of the Prop Auto-On setting.

### Mark a Spot-Lock

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap Spot-Lock
3. Tap Save.


**NOTE:** Spot-Locks are saved to the trolling motor. The trolling motor can save up to 20 Spot-Locks and Waypoints combined.



## Disengage Spot-Lock

1. With Spot-Lock engaged, tap Cancel.

OR

1. With Spot-Lock engaged, tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner.
2. Tap Go To.
3. Tap Cancel Navigation.


## Spot-Lock Jog

Spot-Lock Jog allows you to jog the Spot-Lock location 5 feet in the selected direction from the current Spot-Lock location. The Spot-Lock Jog feature is only available with a Heading Sensor.

1. With Spot-Lock engaged, tap the Forward, Back, Left, or Right buttons to jog the Spot-Lock location 5 feet in the selected direction.

As soon as the boat is jogged to the new location, the new location is immediately saved into a temporary Spot-Lock memory and the boat will relate additional jogging with the temporary Spot-Lock location.


## Go To Spot-Lock


1. Manually navigate the boat to within a quarter mile of the saved Spot-Lock location.
2. Tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner.
3. Tap Go To, and select Spot-Lock.
4. A list of Spot-Locks that are within a quarter mile will appear. Tap the Spot-Lock you want to navigate to. Navigation will start automatically.




## Autopilot


AutoPilot keeps the trolling motor pointed in the direction you want to go. Each time wind or water current moves the boat off course, AutoPilot senses the change and steers itself back to the original heading. The AutoPilot direction is set every time a steering change is made.


 **WARNING!** It is the operator's responsibility to make prudent decisions regarding personal safety and the operation of the vessel. Do NOT leave the autopilot unattended while it is steering the vessel. Watch for obstacles and potential hazards at all times. Be prepared to respond to changing conditions and take manual control of the vessel as required.

 **WARNING!** Do NOT use the autopilot where there may be shallow water, obstacles, or when manual navigation is required, especially in the following situations:

- while navigating or maneuvering in shallow waters or dangerous seabeds,
- while entering or exiting harbor, mooring, or setting sail,
- while traveling at high speed,
- in heavy traffic areas, near breakwaters, canals,
- or while encountering any potential obstacles.

 **WARNING!** Watch for a turning propeller and be prepared for boat movement when working with AutoPilot. If Prop Auto On is turned on, the propeller will automatically turn on when AutoPilot is engaged, even if the engagement is accidental. A turning propeller can cause injury.

 **WARNING!** To cancel AutoPilot navigation, you must select Cancel Navigation and then turn the propeller off. The propeller does not automatically turn off when navigation is canceled.

 **CAUTION!** This unit uses a magnetic compass to detect direction of travel. The compass can be adversely affected by magnets or large, ferrous metal objects near [within 24" of] the trolling motor control head.

Obstructions on the Prop may cause excessive vibration of the motor head. This vibration can cause the compass to wander and erratic steering to occur. Clear the obstruction to return the motor to normal operation.

### Set the AutoPilot Mode

There are two different modes of AutoPilot available: Locked Heading and Locked Course. There are distinct differences between the two AutoPilots and how they control your boat. Both AutoPilots have their benefits based on the type of fishing and bait presentation desired. We highly recommend getting on the water and trying both AutoPilot modes in various fishing situations and applications. With experimentation and time, you will find which AutoPilot works best for you in a given situation.

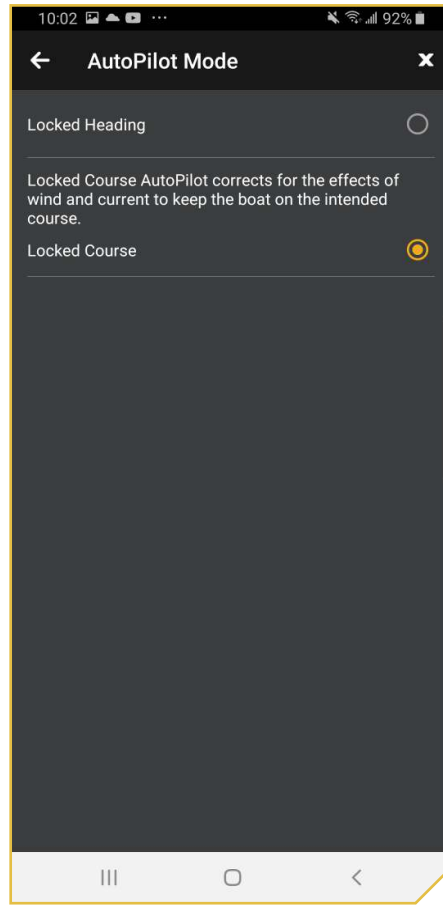
**Locked Heading** uses an internal compass to provide a heading lock. It keeps the motor pointed in the same compass direction. If a manual steering correction is made, this mode locks onto the new compass heading to which the boat was steered. This method of heading tracking does not take into account external forces, such as side winds or currents, which can allow side drift.

**Locked Course** not only uses compass heading but also GPS data to correct for cross winds, current and other external forces to keep the boat on the intended course. This mode generates a set of GPS points in a straight track line in the heading direction. When the user steers to a new heading, a new track line of GPS points are laid down in the new heading direction. When very extreme conditions exist, such as strong winds or current, the trolling motor may not have enough power to control the boat smoothly. In these extreme cases, it may be best to use Locked Heading and let the boat move with the wind or current if the motor is not powerful enough to overcome it.

Use the following instructions to change the AutoPilot mode.

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap the Menu icon in the top, right corner.
3. Tap AutoPilot Mode, and select either Locked Heading or Locked Course.

## Change AutoPilot Mode (Google Android Phone)



### Engage AutoPilot


1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap AutoPilot.
3. Tap the Prop to turn the motor on.
4. **Adjust Heading:** To adjust the desired heading, manually steer the motor to a new heading using the Propeller controls or tap Adjust to adjust your course by 5 degree intervals.

### AutoPilot Adjust Course - Angle

The angle from the current intended course can be adjusted in 5 degree increments.

1. While AutoPilot is engaged, tap Adjust, which is located just below the Course readout.
2. The Adjust Course menu will appear at the bottom of the screen. Tap the left or right arrows to adjust the course angle by 5 degree increments.
3. The new course will be updated on the Display Screen.

1. While AutoPilot is engaged, tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner.
2. Tap Go To.
3. Tap Adjust Course.
4. The Adjust Course menu will appear. Tap the left or right arrows to adjust the course angle by 5 degree increments.
5. The new course will be updated on the Display Screen.

## AutoPilot Adjust Course - Jog for Locked Course AutoPilot

AutoPilot Jog allows the AutoPilot course to be temporarily adjusted to the left or right. AutoPilot Jog is only available in Locked Course AutoPilot.

1. While AutoPilot is engaged, tap Adjust, which is located just below the Course readout.
2. The Adjust Course menu will appear at the bottom of the screen with Angle to the left and Jog to the right. Tap the left or right arrows by Jog to adjust the course by 5 foot increments.

## Disengage AutoPilot


**⚠ WARNING!** The propeller does not automatically turn off when navigation is canceled.

1. While AutoPilot is engaged, tap the AutoPilot button again.

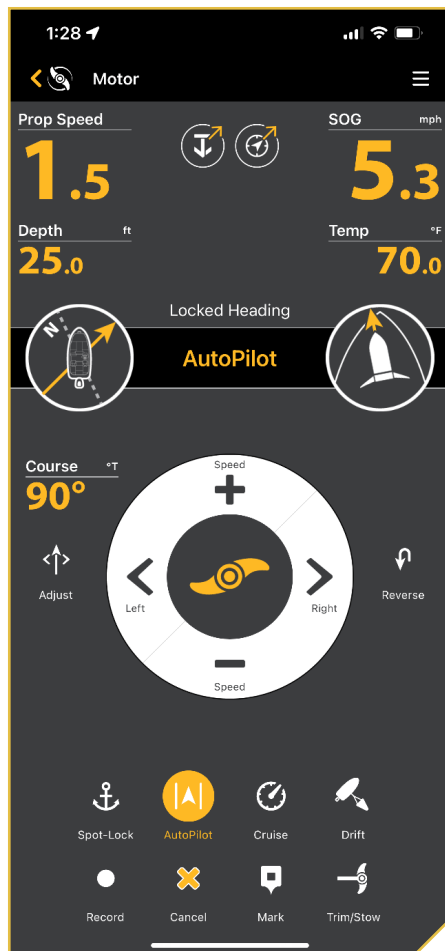

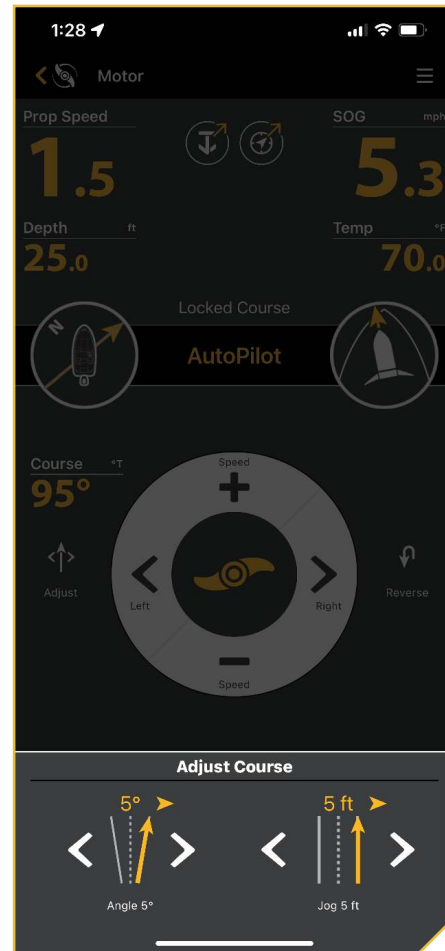

## Cruise Control

Cruise Control helps to compensate for the variations in external forces that affect the speed over ground and keeps the boat traveling at an even speed. When Cruise Control is engaged, the current speed over ground becomes the Target Speed. Cruise Control works to control the propeller speed to match the Speed Over Ground to the Target Speed.

**WARNING!** Watch for a turning propeller and be prepared for boat movement when working with Cruise Control. The propeller will automatically turn on when Cruise Control is engaged, even if the engagement is accidental. A turning propeller can cause injury. The propeller will turn on for Cruise Control regardless of the Prop Auto-On setting.

### Engage Cruise Control

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap Cruise Control.
3. Tap Increase Speed or Decrease Speed to adjust the target speed and the Prop speed will adjust accordingly based on current conditions.

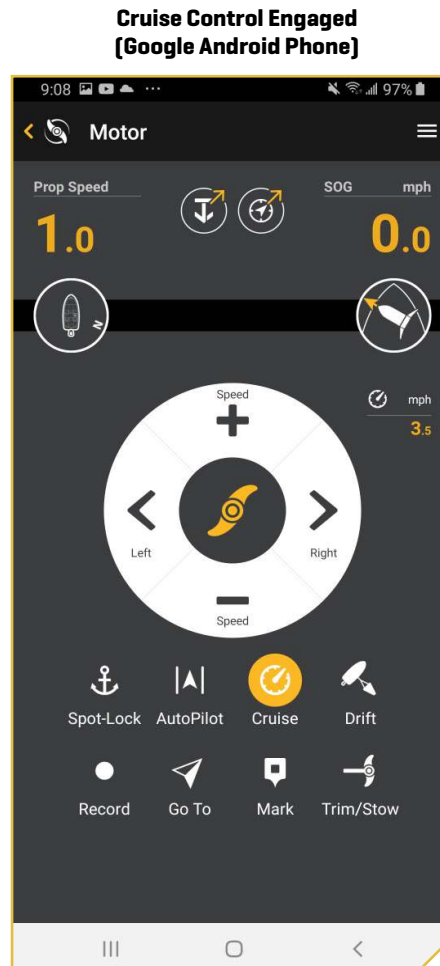
**NOTE:** SOG refers to Speed Over Ground. SOG is the speed the boat is actually traveling. The Target Speed is the speed you are asking the Cruise Control to achieve.

### Disengage Cruise Control

1. While Cruise Control is engaged, tap the Cruise Control button again.  
The Cruise Control Target Speed will disappear from the screen.

**NOTE:** If Cruise Control is engaged, making adjustments to motor speed from the Foot Pedal will cancel Cruise Control.

**NOTE:** When you disengage Cruise Control, it will not stop the propeller.



## Max Speed

Max Speed sets the Prop speed to Speed 10 when engaged and returns to the previously set speed when disengaged. Max Speed can be engaged regardless of what the current Prop speed is.

**WARNING!** Watch for a turning Prop when Max Speed is engaged. A turning Prop can cause injury. Max Speed will automatically turn the Prop Speed to Speed 10, even if the engagement is accidental. Max Speed is not affected by Prop Auto On.

### Engage Max Speed

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. While the Prop is engaged, tap and hold Speed Up. The Max Speed icon will display next to the Prop Speed.

### Disengage Max Speed

1. When Max Speed is engaged, tap Speed Down to disengage. The Max Speed icon will disappear from the display screen.



## Drift Mode

Drift Mode combines AutoPilot features with Cruise Control. Engaging drift mode will keep the trolling motor pointed in the direction you want to go, and at the speed you want.


### Engage Drift Mode

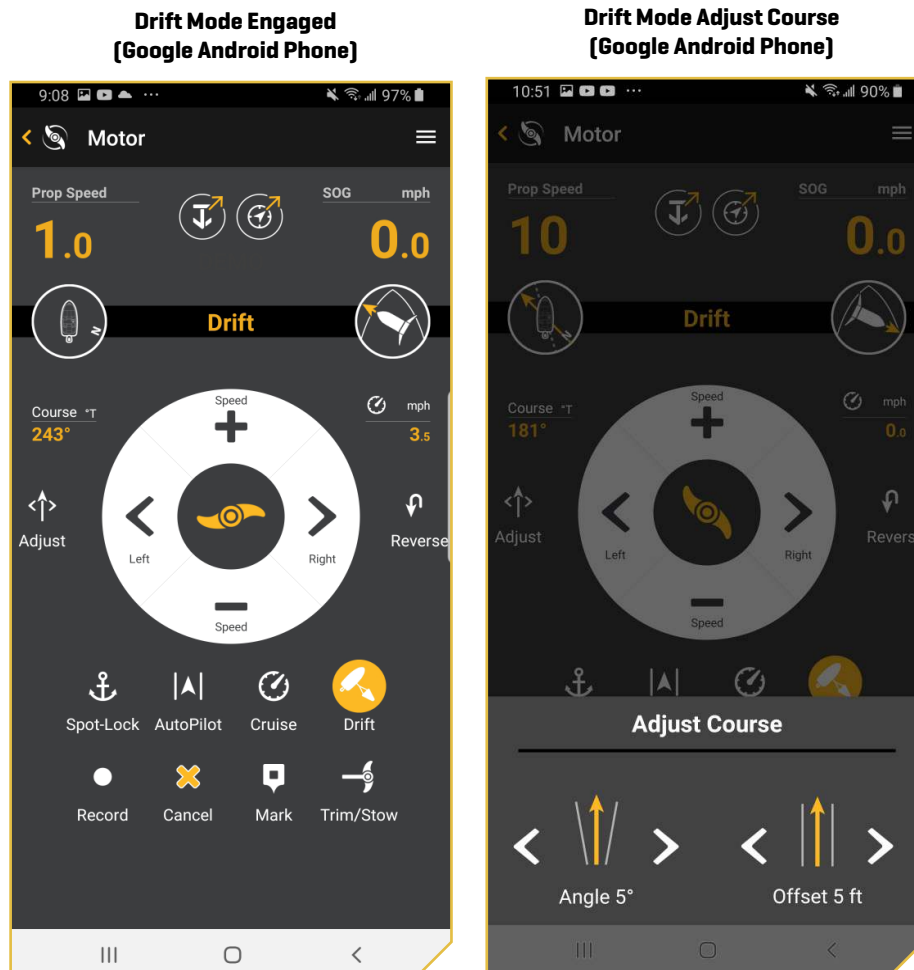

2. Tap Drift Mode.
3. **Adjust Heading:** To adjust the desired heading, manually steer the motor to a new heading using the Propeller controls. This feature is only available if Dodge mode is turned off.

### Adjust Course - Angle

1. With Drift Mode is engaged, tap Adjust, which is located just below the Course readout.
2. The Adjust Course menu will appear at the bottom of the screen. Tap the left or right arrows to adjust the course angle by 5 degree increments.
3. The new course will be updated on the Display Screen.

OR

1. With Drift Mode is engaged, tap the Menu  icon in the top, right corner.
2. Tap Go To.
3. Tap Adjust Course.
4. Under Angle, tap the Left or Right Arrows to adjust the course by 5-degree increments.



## Drift Mode Jog

Drift Mode Jog allows the Drift course to be adjusted to the left or right and still maintain the same course.

1. While Drift Mode is engaged, tap Adjust, which is located just below the Course readout.
2. The Adjust Course menu will appear at the bottom of the screen with Angle to the left and Jog to the right. Tap the left or right arrows by Jog to adjust the course by 5-foot increments.

**OR**

1. With Drift Mode is engaged, tap the Menu ☰ icon in the top, right corner.
2. Tap Go To.
3. Tap Adjust Course.
4. Under Jog, tap the Left or Right Arrows to adjust the course by 5-foot increments.

## Reverse Drift Mode

Reverse Drift Mode allows the user to change target course to the opposite direction of travel.

1. While Drift Mode is engaged, tap Reverse, which is located just below the Speed readout.

1. With Drift Mode is engaged, tap the Menu ☰ icon in the top, right corner.
2. Tap Go To.
3. Tap Reverse Navigation.

## Disengage Drift Mode

1. With Drift Mode is engaged, tap the Drift Mode button again.

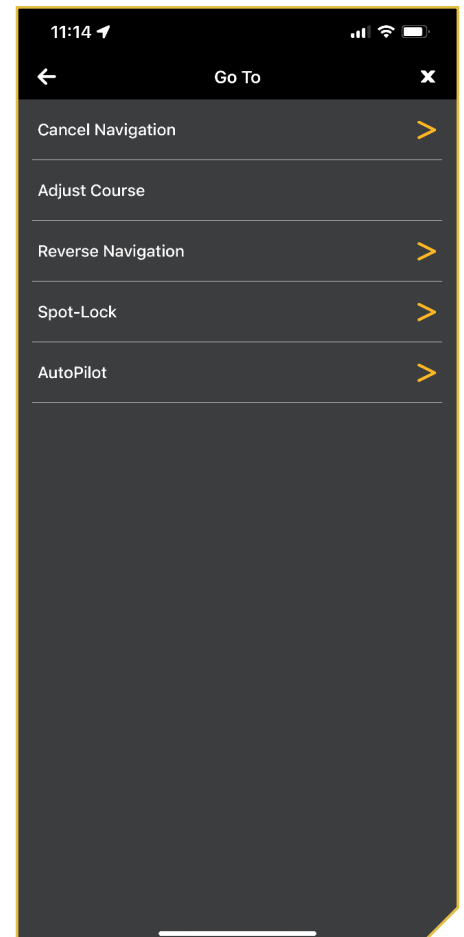

## Record an iTrack

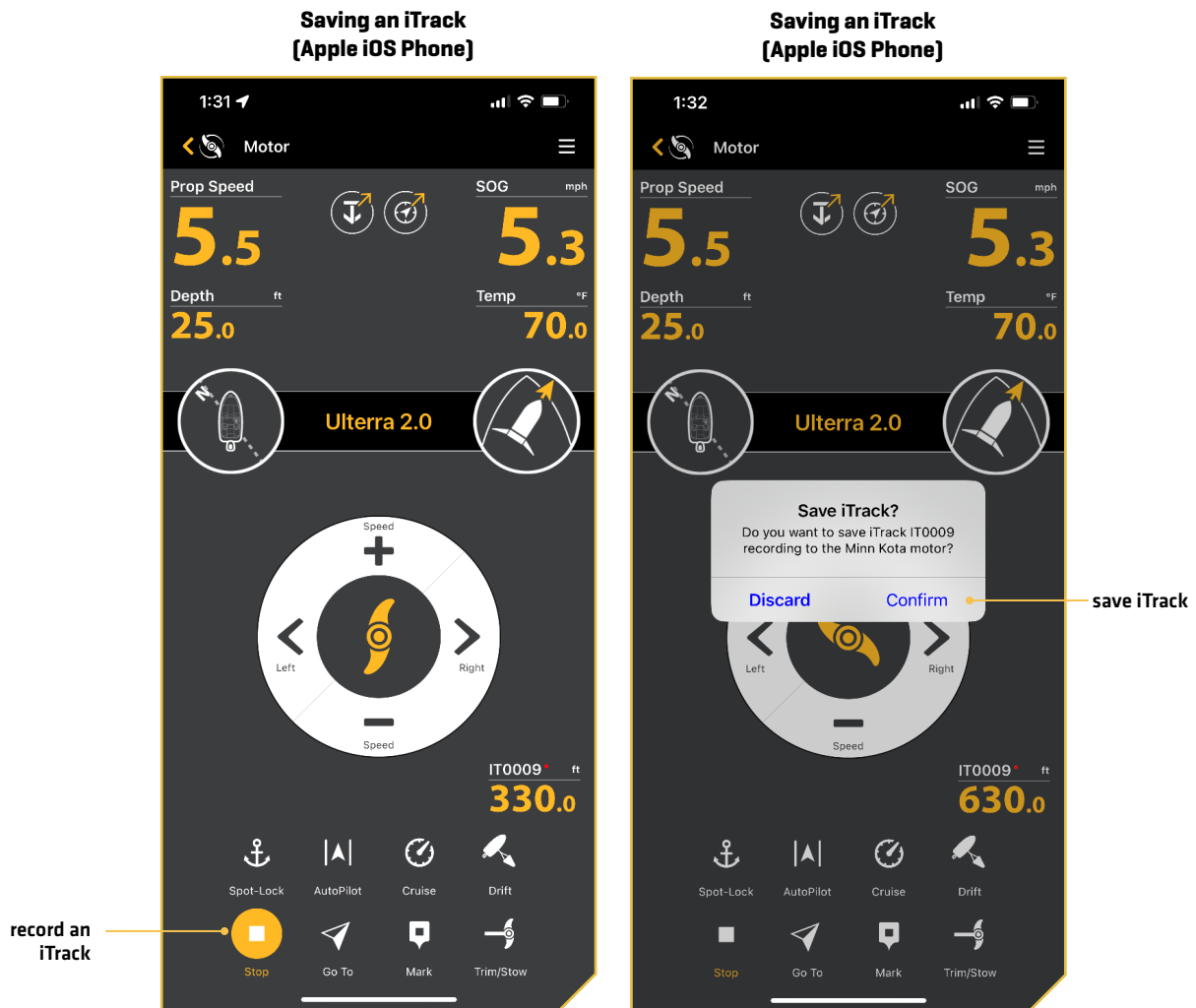
When Record iTrack is turned on, iTrack recording will begin from the current vessel position, and will automatically stop when a 2 mile distance is achieved. The boat must already be moving when iTrack recording is initiated. iTrack is only available with the following modes of navigation: Manual, Cruise Control, and AutoPilot.

### Start iTrack Recording

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Start navigation.
3. Tap Record.

### Stop iTrack Recording

1. While iTrack is recording, tap Stop.
2. Save or Discard: Follow the on-screen prompts to save the iTrack.





## Mark a Waypoint

Waypoints are saved latitude/longitude positions. They mark a position of interest such as your favorite fishing area, structure or marker buoy. Waypoints work similar to Spot-Locks. When i-Pilot navigates Waypoints, i-Pilot takes control over all steering functions; speed can be manually controlled or the Cruise Control function can also be used. For more information on how to work with Waypoints please see your Humminbird manual.

### Mark a Waypoint

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap Mark.  
A waypoint is created and saved to the motor control head.



## Circle Mode

Circle Mode uses a compatible Humminbird fish finder to set a point to navigate around. Once a point is set, the boat can navigate either clockwise or counterclockwise around the set point in a circle. The radius of the circle can be set between 30 to 500 feet. Circle Mode cannot be activated from the OBN App, but the direction of travel, radius of the circle can be adjusted, and the function can be disengaged using the app. See the Humminbird manual to learn more about Circle Mode.

**⚠️ WARNING!** Watch for a turning Prop when working with Circle Mode. Auto Prop On is set to “off” by default. If Auto Prop On is turned “on,” the Prop will automatically turn on when Circle Mode is engaged, even if the engagement is accidental. A turning Prop can cause injury. If Auto Prop On is turned “off,” the Prop must be enabled before the boat will begin navigating with Circle Mode.

### Change the Radius

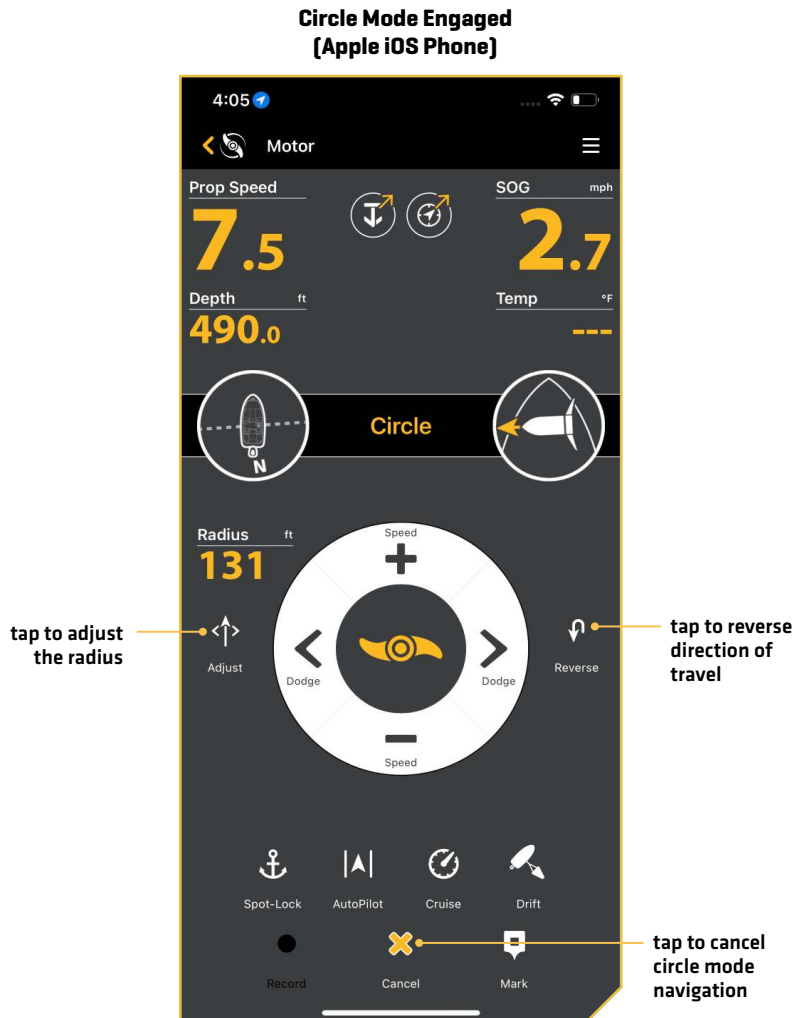
1. While Circle Mode is engaged, tap Adjust, which is located just below the Radius readout.
2. The Adjust Radius menu will appear at the bottom of the screen. Tap the left or right arrows to adjust the circle radius by 5-foot increments.
3. The new radius will be updated on the Display Screen.

### Reverse Direction

1. While Circle Mode is engaged, tap Reverse, which is located to the right of the screen.

Follow the Contour allows you to navigate a contour on all Humminbird LakeMaster, CoastMaster, and AutoChart ZeroLine charts. When starting Follow the Contour, all other types of navigation are stopped on the fish finder and the Ethernet network. The boat can navigate either clockwise or counterclockwise around the contour. The Offset from the contour can range from -300 to +300 feet. Follow the Contour cannot be activated from the OBN App, but the direction of travel, the contour offset, and disengaging the function can be performed using the app. See the Humminbird manual to learn more about Follow the Contour. If using an AutoChart ZeroLine Map Card, see the AutoChart ZeroLine Map Card Accessory Manual for more information.

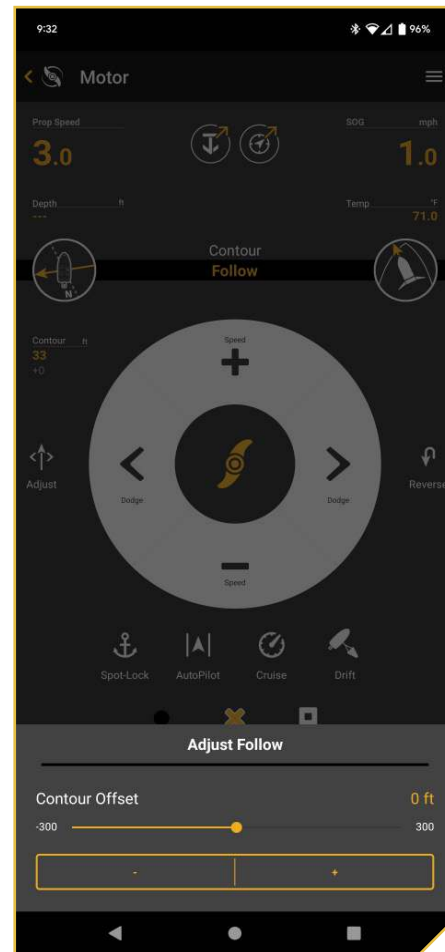

The boat can navigate either clockwise or counterclockwise around the shoreline. The Offset from the shoreline can range from 10 to 300 feet. Follow the Shoreline cannot be activated from the OBN App, but the direction of travel, the shoreline offset, and disengaging the function can be performed using the app. See the Humminbird manual to learn more about Follow the Shoreline.

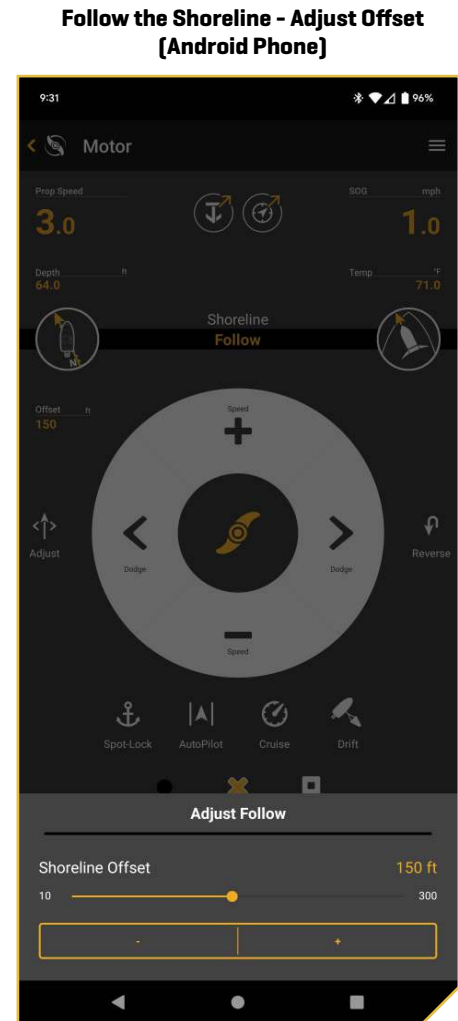
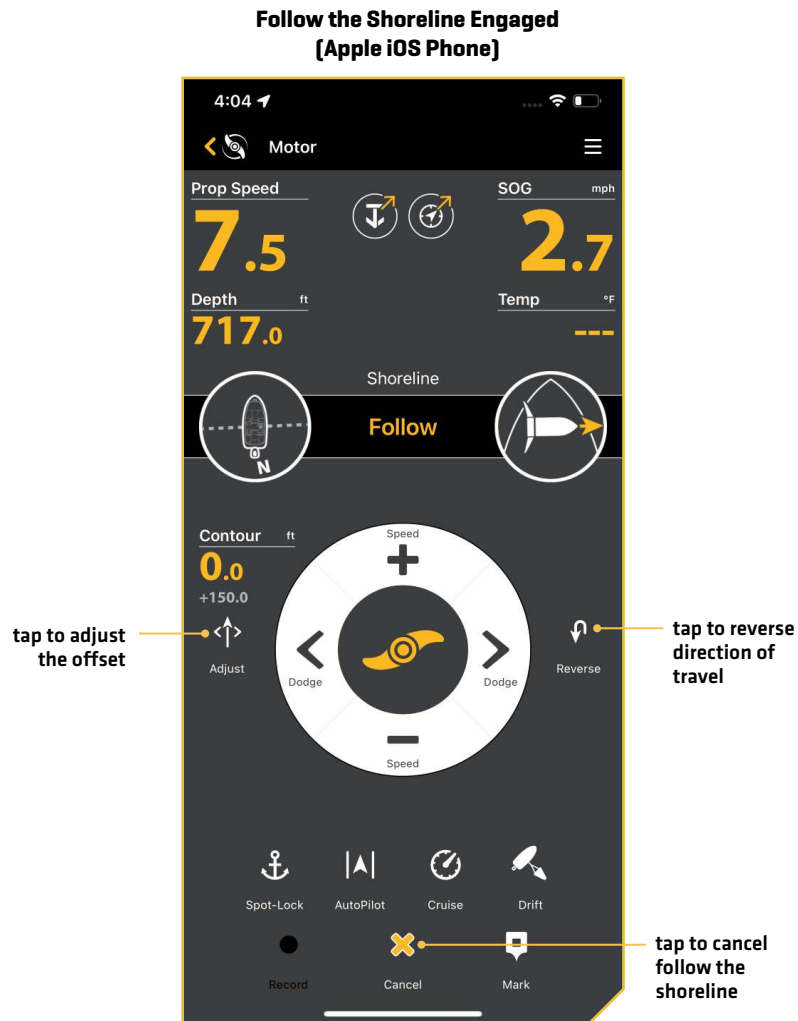

## Deploy or Stow the Trolling Motor

The first time you deploy the motor (after installation or after defaults have been reset), you will adjust the trim for operation. The motor will save the most-recent trim setting and apply it when the motor is deployed again.


1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap Trim/Stow. The Trim/Stow/Deploy box will appear.
3. Tap Deploy.

**Pause:** Tap the Pause button.

### Adjust the Trim

When trimming the motor using the One-Boat Network App, the motor is programmed to operate safely and limit Prop rotation when it is within certain limits. The Prop will temporarily stop while trimming the motor and resume once trimming is stopped. Trim limits are in place to avoid damage to the unit. An upper trim limit is set 12" from the bottom of the mount to the center of the lower unit. A lower trim is set approximately 1.5" from the bottom of the control head to the trim housing. A Prop lockout region, defined as 14" from the bottom of the mount to the center of the lower unit, is used to eliminate the possibility of the motor contacting the boat hull. All functions, with the exception of manual steer and record iTrack, are canceled upon trimming into this region.


Use the following instructions to adjust the trim.

 **NOTE:** The Trim option is only displayed when the motor is deployed.

1. Tap Motor from the Home screen to access the Motor view.
2. Tap Trim/Stow. The Trim/Stow/Deploy box will appear.
3. Tap Trim Up or Trim Down.

2. Tap the Menu icon in the top, right corner.
3. **With a Basemap displayed**, under Chart Settings, tap Orientation.  
**With a VX Chart displayed**, under Chart Settings, tap General, and then tap Orientation.
4. Tap Head Up or North Up to select your chart orientation.

<b>North Up</b>	The chart is oriented with North up on the display, and the boat rotates according to its heading or COG [Course Over Ground].
<b>Head Up</b>	The boat's current heading points up, and the chart rotates around the boat icon so that it always points up on the display. The heading is provided by the mobile device's internal compass.

## Adjust the Water Level Offset

It is important to note if the water is higher or lower than usual. For example, if you know the lake is down 4 feet, set the Water Level Offset to -4. The displayed numbers on the Contour Lines will adjust from the Water Level Offset setting, and the water level offset will be highlighted in brown to extend the land visually on the display.

1. Tap Chart View.
2. Tap the Menu icon in the top, right corner.
3. Scroll down to Chart Setup, and tap the Water Level Offset toggle.
4. Drag the slider bar to set the water level offset.

**If the water level is higher than normal**, set a positive amount.

**If the water level is lower than normal**, set a negative amount.

**If the water level has not changed [normal]**, turn off Water Level Offset.

## Select a Chart Preset

Use Chart Presets to quickly alternate between settings. You can use the default Fishing or Navigation settings provided, or you can create a custom User preset with your preferences. The Fishing and Navigation presets are also fully customizable. You can restore each preset back to its default settings at any time.



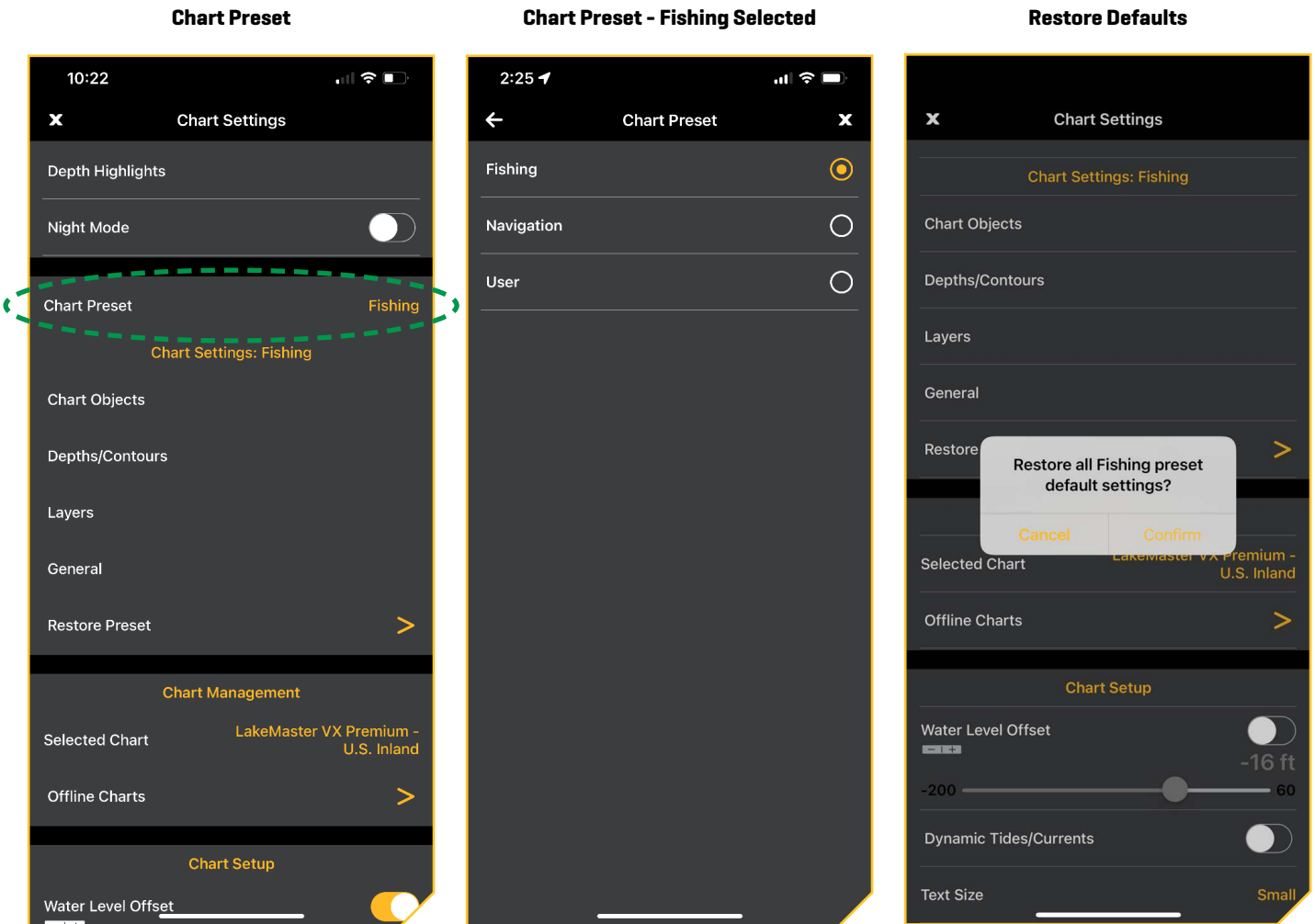
**NOTE:** Chart Presets are only available with a Premium subscription.

1. Tap Chart View.
2. Tap the Menu icon in the top, right corner.
3. Tap Chart Preset.
4. Tap Fishing, Navigation or User. The Chart Settings will be updated based on the preset selected.

## Restore Preset Defaults

You can restore the Fishing and Navigation Preset defaults at any time.

  - Water:** Shows wrecks, rocks, obstructions, natural water features, fishing objects, and the nature of the seabed.
  - Land:** Shows ports, shoreline objects, roads, points of interest (POIs) and POI labels, and natural land features.
5. When a Chart Object group is enabled, tap an individual chart object to show or hide it. [check mark = visible, blank = hidden]

## Show/Hide Spot Soundings

Spot Soundings are depth measurements shown on the chart.

1. Tap Chart View.
2. Tap the Menu icon in the top, right corner.
3. Under Chart Settings, tap Chart Objects.
4. Tap Spot Soundings to show or hide it. [check mark = visible, blank = hidden]
5. If Spot Soundings is enabled, tap and drag the Soundings Filter slider to adjust the depth level.



**NOTE:** Tap the -/+ icon to preview the chart while adjusting the setting.

## Show/Hide Rocks

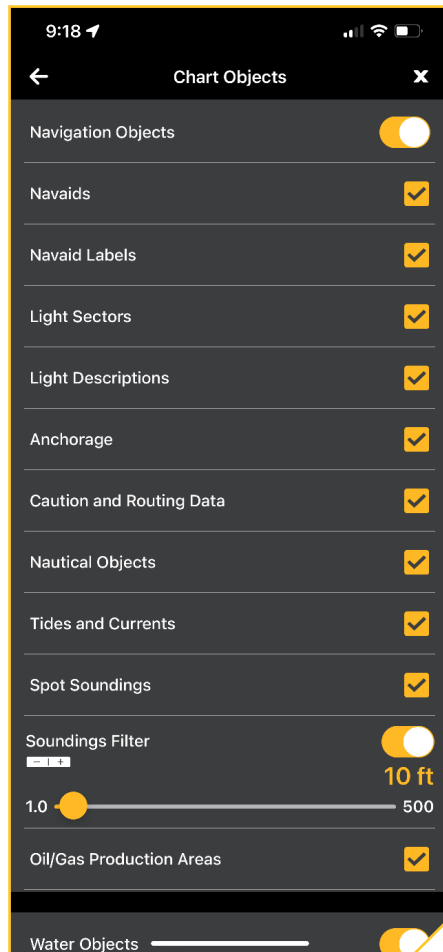

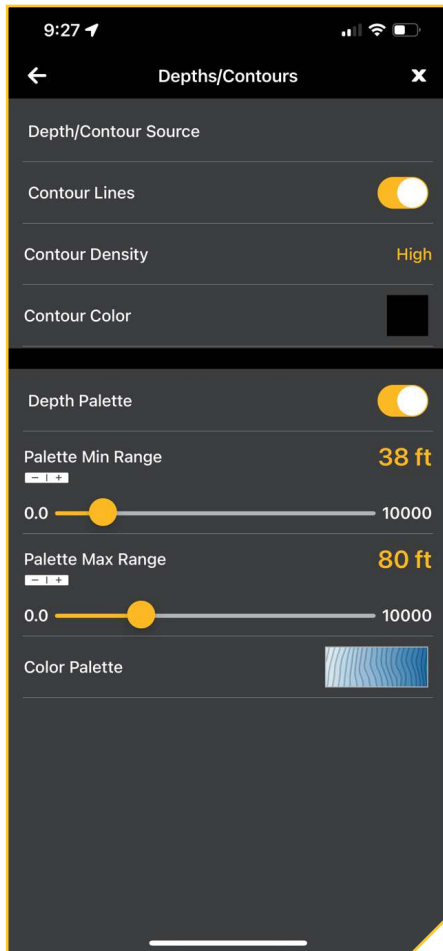

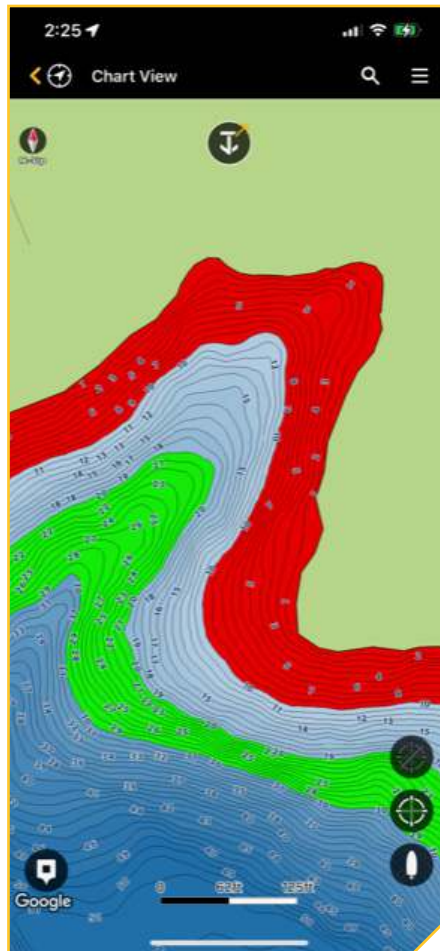

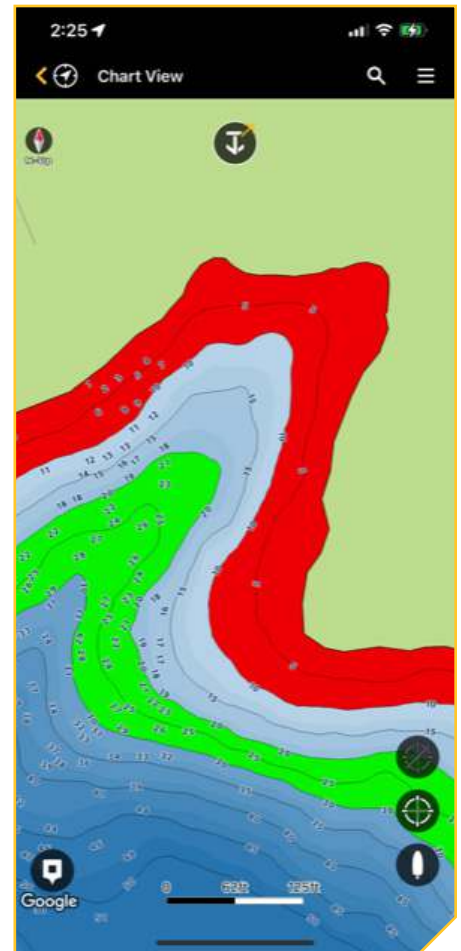

## Set Depth Highlights

For example, if you know a certain fish is holding at 18 to 20 feet, you can set the Depth Highlight at 19 feet, and the Depth Highlight Range at +/- 1 foot. The view will show a highlighted band in the chosen color from 18 to 20 feet. You can select up to 4 Depth Highlights.

## Highlight Shallow Water

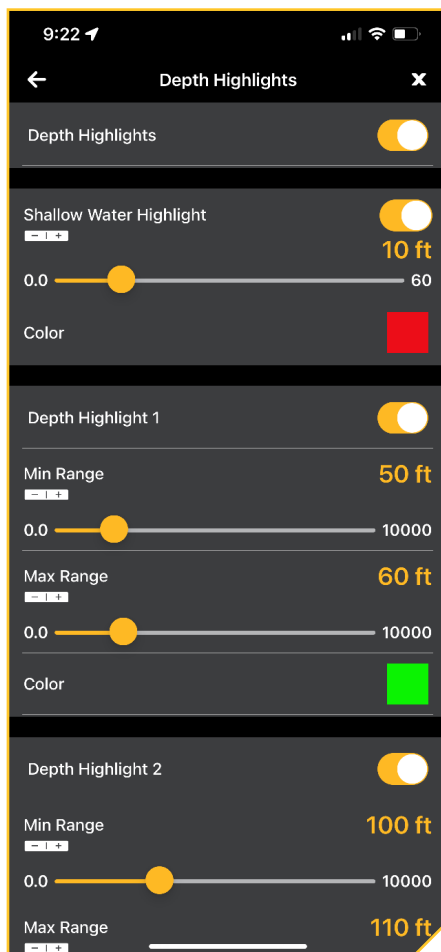

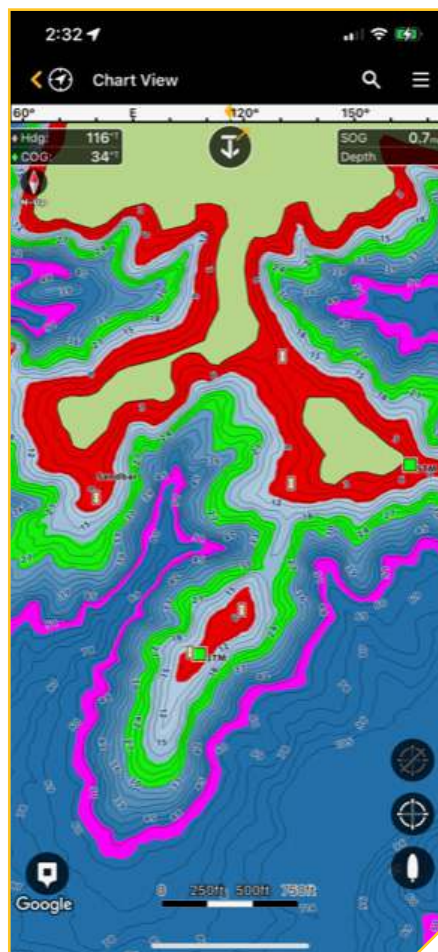

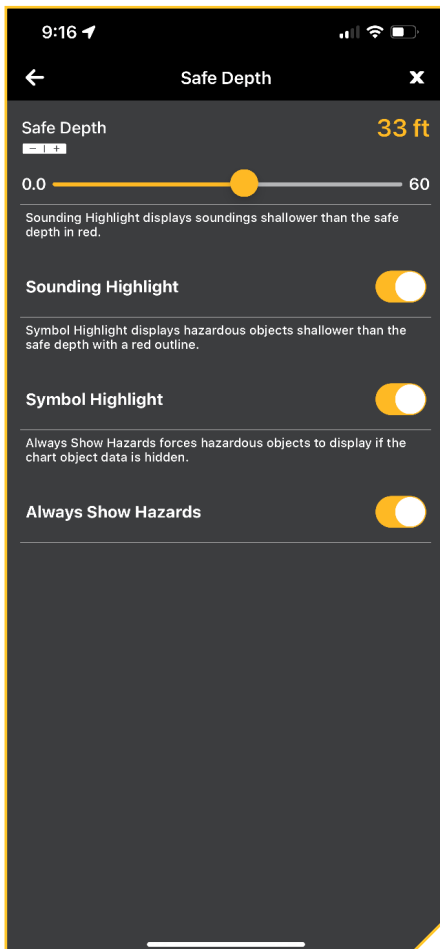

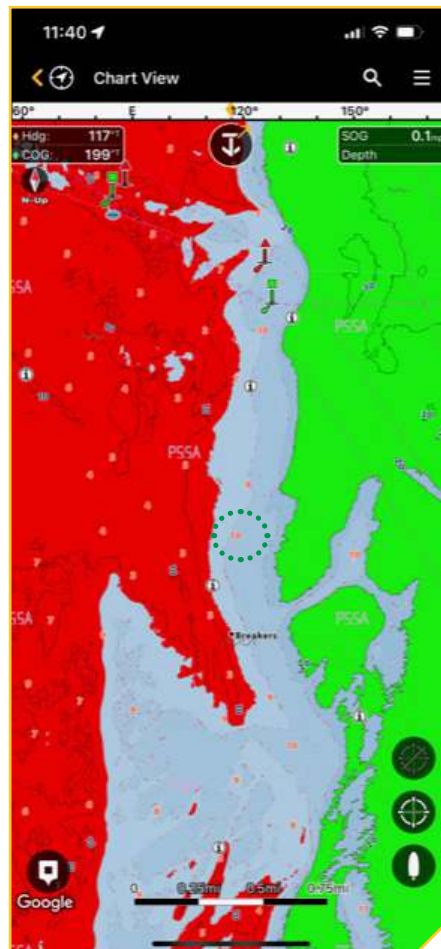

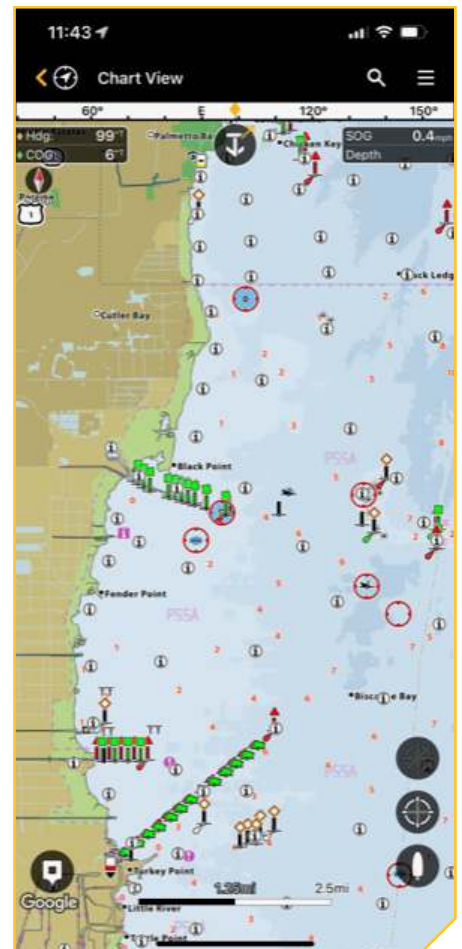

## Change Layers

You can display layers that show aerial imagery (available for Premium lakes and coast), shaded relief or bottom hardness in Chart View. The transparency of Shaded Relief and Bottom Hardness is customizable. The source and display area for Aerial Imagery can be changed.

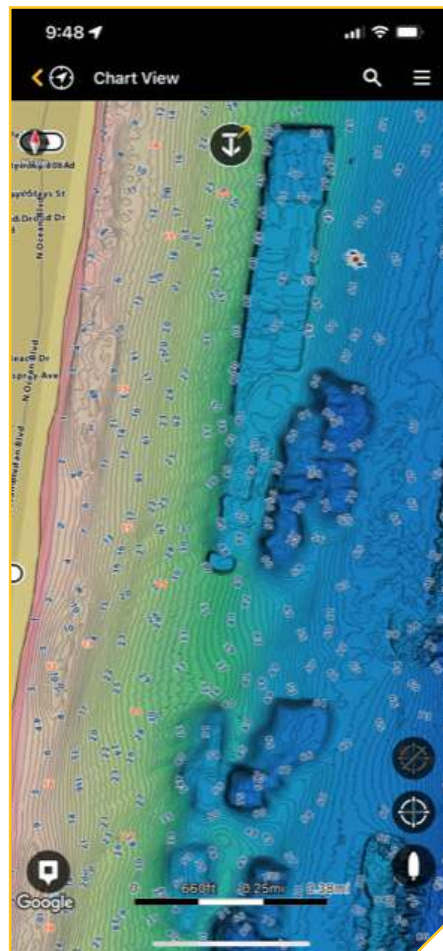

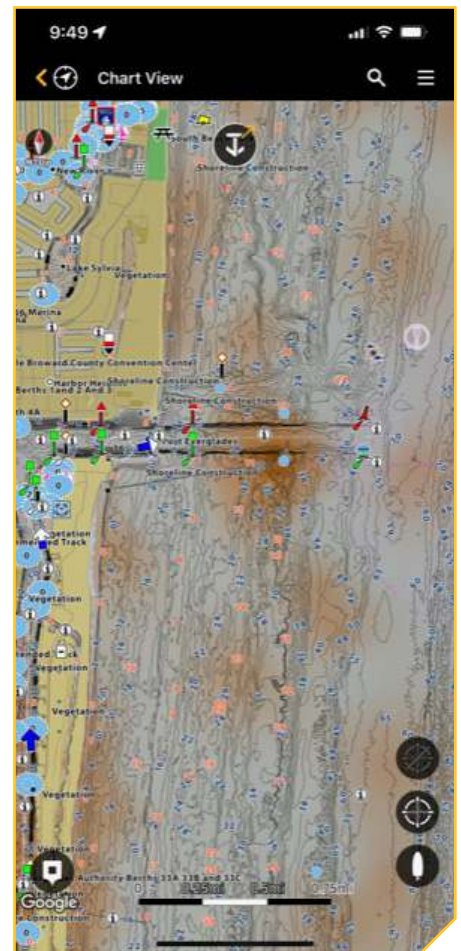

# MY CHARTS

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You can subscribe to VX Charts of USA and Canada directly from your mobile device. A Wi-Fi or cellular data connection is required. A VX Chart yearly subscription provides online and offline access to Humminbird LakeMaster VX and CoastMaster VX Premium US and Canada cartography. The subscription includes access to the following features:

- The highest detail contour lines available from LakeMaster and CoastMaster charts.
- 10,000+ US and Canadian lakes and complete US coastal coverage.
- Offline access of chart data.
- Layers including shaded relief, aerial photography and bottom hardness.
- Switch from fishing charts to nautical charts, or create your own custom view settings.
- Plan your fishing day with CoastMaster predictive tide and current data.

 **NOTE:** Refer to your fish finder operations manual for more information about waypoints, routes, and tracks.

Waypoints, routes and tracks can be viewed from the Chart View, but their data can also be managed from My Data. Instructions in this section will cover how to access features from both Chart View and My Data.

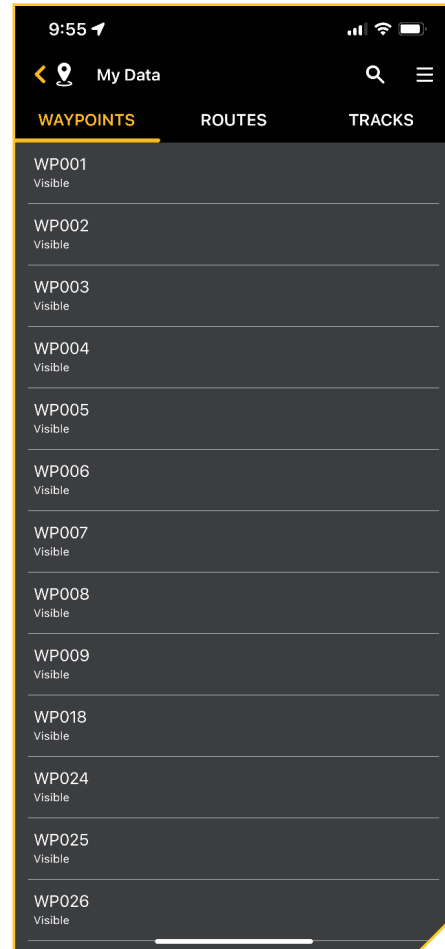

## Mark Waypoints

Waypoints are saved latitude/longitude positions. They mark a position of interest such as your favorite fishing area, structure, or marker buoy.

Open Chart View on the One-Boat Network App, and use the following instructions to mark waypoints on the chart. You can edit the waypoint name, coordinates, and add notes in the My Data menu.

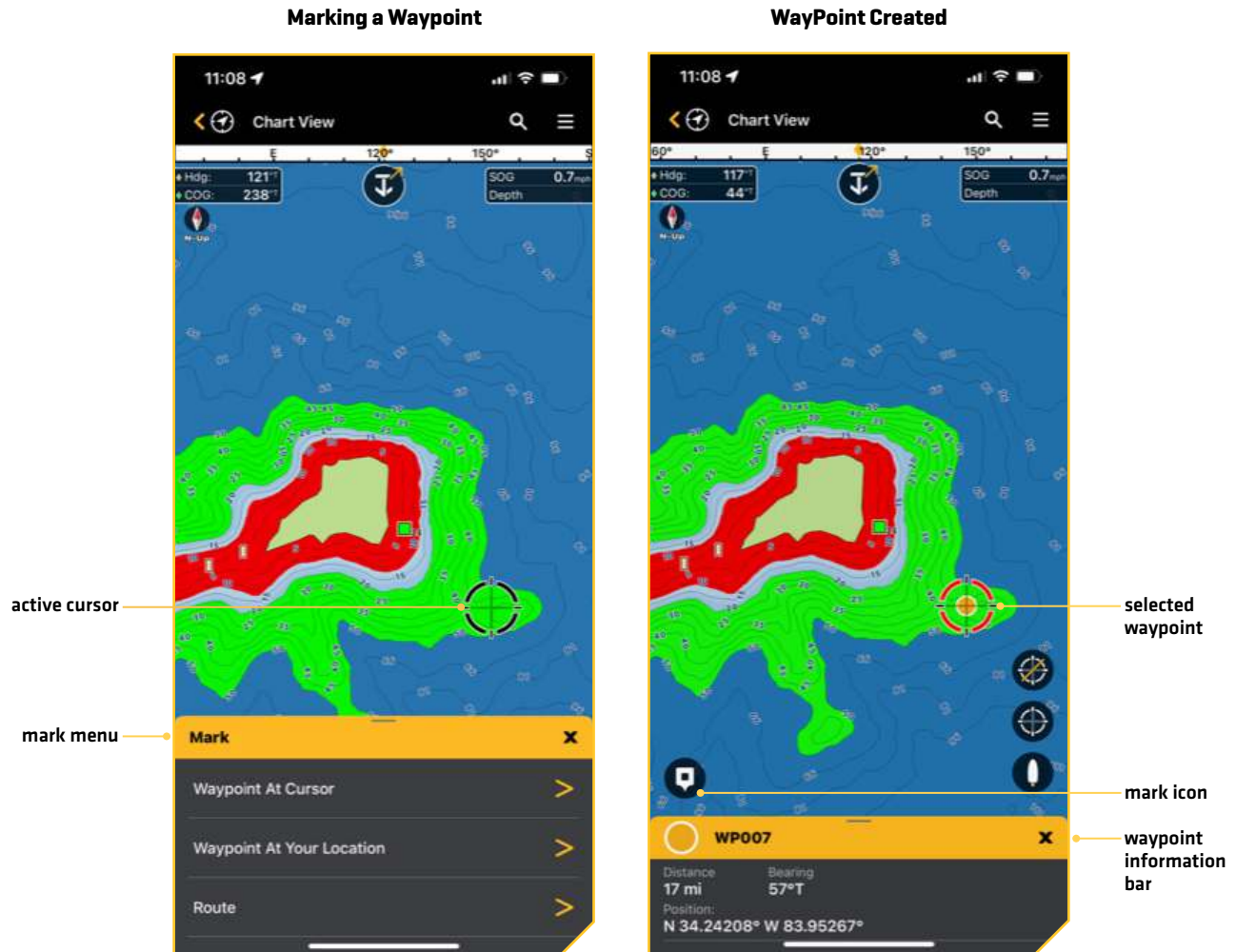

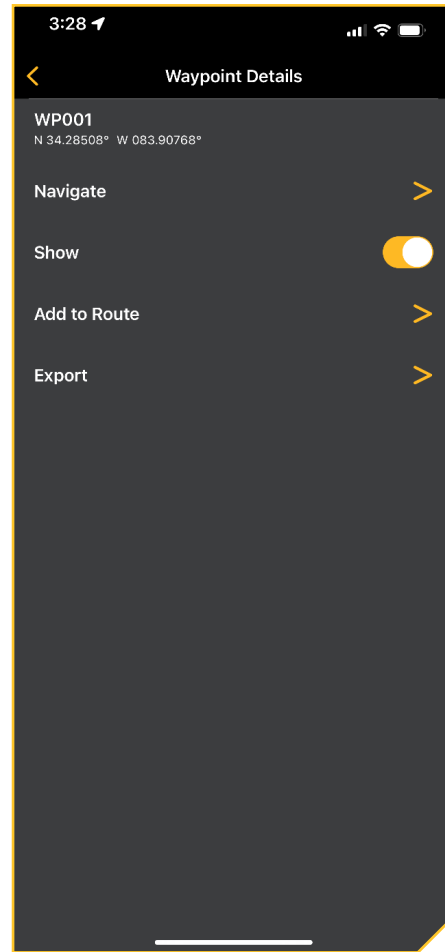

## Create Routes

Routes link two or more waypoints together to create a path for navigation. A route represents your intended navigation and shows the shortest path from each data point to the next. The distance between each waypoint is a route leg.

Display a chart on your mobile device and use the following instructions to create routes on the chart. You can edit the route name, coordinates, and add notes in the Routes menu.

**WARNING!** You should always be aware of your surroundings and watch for any potential obstacles.

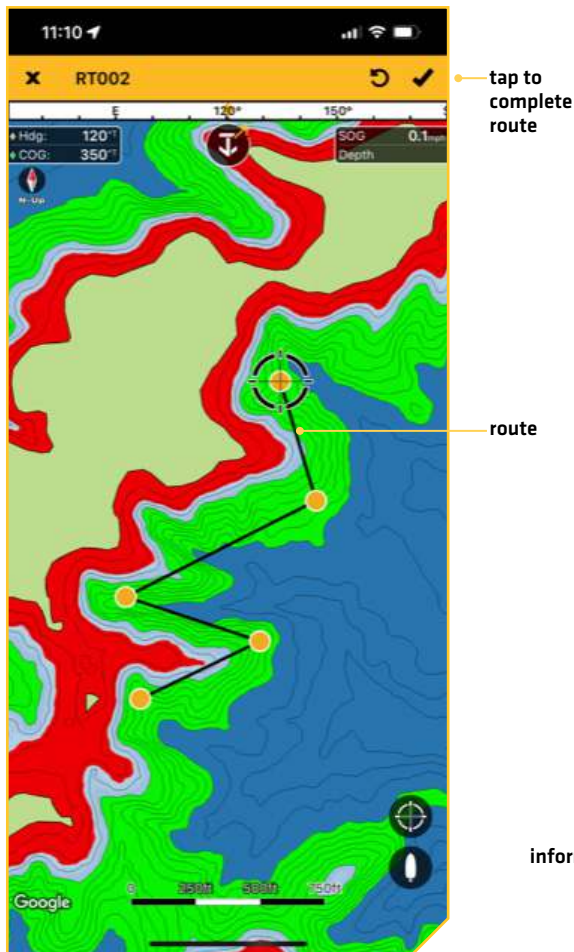

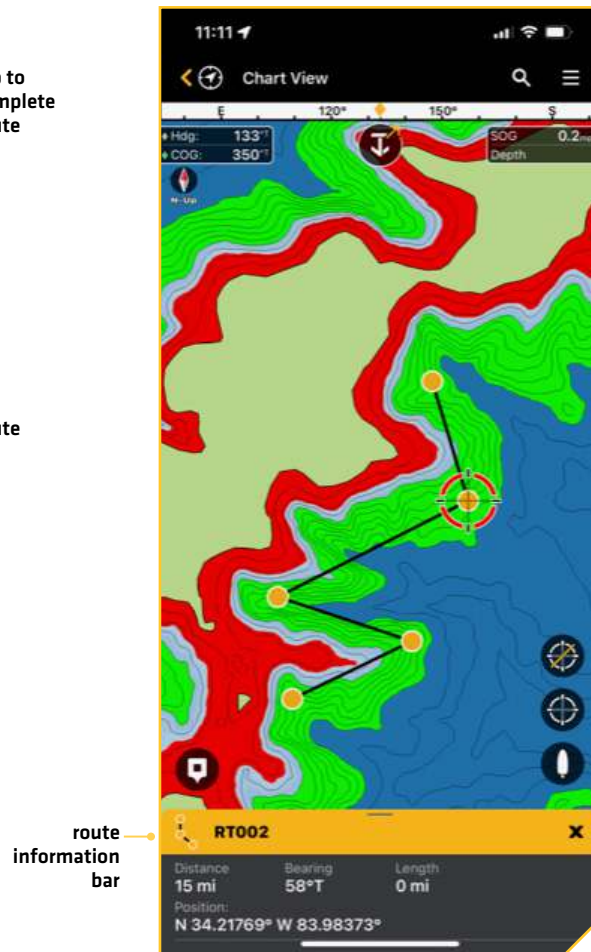

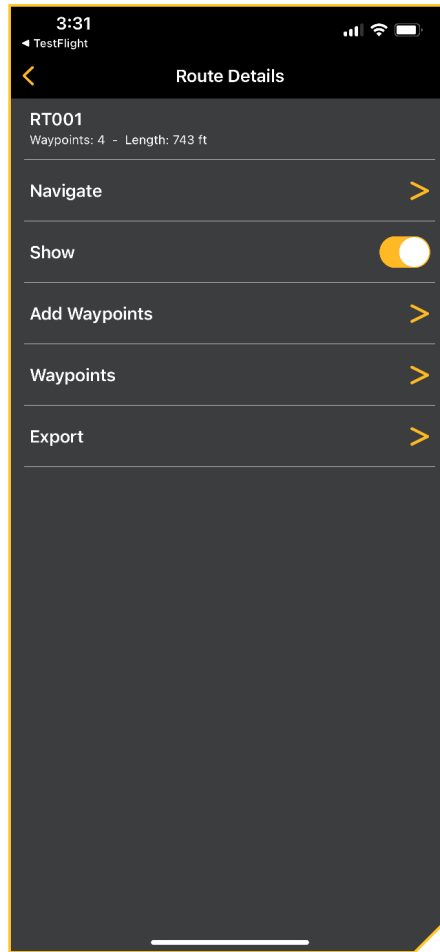

3. Deselect the Show toggle to hide the route. Select the Show toggle to display the route.

## Display/Hide a Saved Route from the My Data Menu

Use the following instructions to display or hide a saved waypoint from the chart display.

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu.
2. Tap the Route tab to list all the saved routes.
3. **Apple iOS:** Tap the route name to open the Route Details screen.  
**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon next to the name of the route.
4. **Apple iOS:** Deselect the Show toggle to hide the route. Select the Show toggle to display the route.  
**Google Android:** Tap Show/Hide to show or hide a route.

## Delete a Saved Route from the Chart Display


1. With the chart displayed on-screen, tap the route.
2. Swipe up on the route information bar.
3. Tap Delete.

## Delete a Saved Route from the My Data Menu

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu.
2. Tap the Route tab.
3. **Apple iOS:** Swipe left on the route name using one finger.  
**Google Android:** Press and hold a route until it is highlighted.
4. **Apple iOS:** Tap Delete.  
**Google Android:** Tap the Trash icon, and then tap Delete.

## Create Tracks


A track is a collection of track points that contains the boat's detailed position history at set intervals. You can clear the Current Track or save it at any time. You can also edit saved track names and add notes in the My Data menu.

 **WARNING!** You should always be aware of your surroundings and watch for any potential obstacles.

## Create a Track

Use the following instructions to start a new track.

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Tap New Track. The track will begin recording immediately at the present boat position.  
**Google Android:** Tap the plus icon. The track will begin recording immediately at the present boat position.

 **NOTE:** It is important to end the track before closing the One-Boat Network App or powering off the mobile device.

## Pause/Resume Track Recording

You can pause and resume a live track while it is recording.

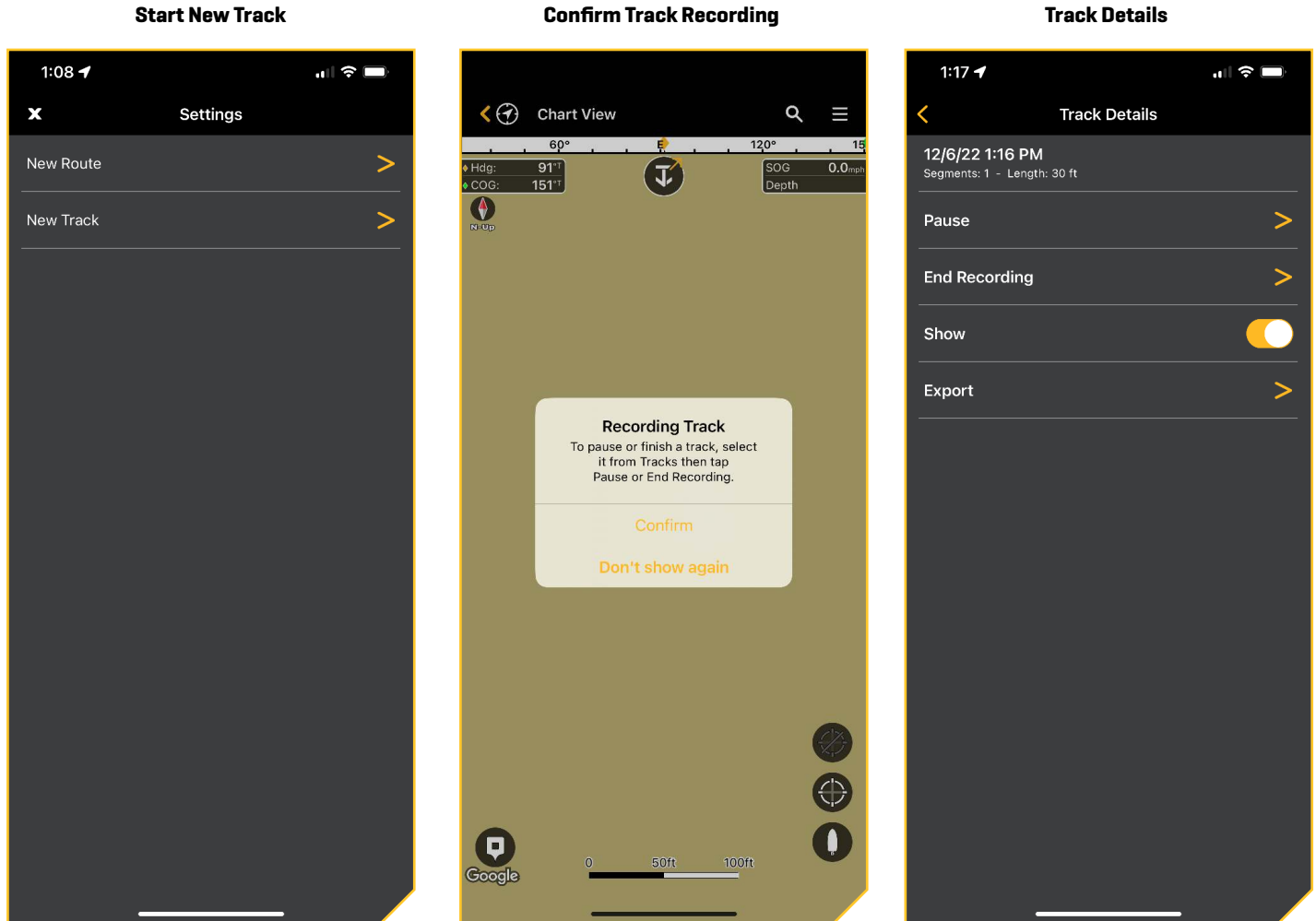
1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Tap the track to open the Track Details screen.  
**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon.
3. Tap Pause/Resume.



## Stop Track Recording

Ending the track recording will automatically save the track.

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Tap the track to open the Track Details screen.  
**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon.
3. Tap End Recording. The track will be automatically saved.



## Edit a Saved Track

You can change the track name and add notes.

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Tap the track to open the Track Details screen. Tap the track name again to open the Edit Track menu to change the name, add notes, etc. Edits are automatically saved.
3. **Google Android:** Tap the track to open the Track Details screen. Use this screen to change the name, add notes, etc. Edits are automatically saved.

## Delete a Track

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Swipe left on the track name using one finger.  
**Google Android:** Press and hold a track until it is highlighted.
3. **Apple iOS:** Tap Delete.  
**Google Android:** Tap the Trash icon, and then tap Delete.


## Display/Hide a Saved Track


Use the following instructions to display or hide a saved track from the chart display.


1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Tap the track to open the Track Details screen.  
**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon next to the track you want to display/hide.
3. **Apple iOS:** Deselect the Show toggle to hide the track. Select the Show toggle to display the track.  
**Google Android:** Tap Hide/Show.

# NAVIGATING WITH ONE-BOAT NETWORK

Location Services must be enabled on your mobile device for GPS tracking and navigation.

 **WARNING!** This device should not be used as a navigational aid to prevent collision, grounding, boat damage, or personal injury. When the boat is moving, water depth may change too quickly to allow time for you to react. Always operate the boat at very slow speeds if you suspect shallow water or submerged objects.

 **WARNING!** The electronic chart is an aid to navigation designed to facilitate the use of authorized government charts, not to replace them. Only official government charts and notices to mariners contain all of the current information needed for the safety of navigation, and the captain is responsible for their prudent use.

 **WARNING!** You should always be aware of your surroundings and watch for any potential obstacles.

## What's on the Navigation Display

When you start navigation, the chart orientation icon displays the current setting [North-Up, Head-Up] and the following digital readouts display on the screen:

Label	Name	Description
DTN	Distance to Next	The distance between the boat position and the next waypoint on the route.
TTN	Time to Next	The estimated time required to reach the next waypoint on the route.
DTE	Distance to Next	The distance between the boat position and the last waypoint on the route.
TTE	Time to End	The estimated time required to reach the last waypoint on the route.
CTS	Course to Steer	The estimated course that the boat should steer in order to arrive at a waypoint.
XTE	Cross Track Error	The straight-line distance of the boat from the intended route. XTE measures how far the boat is off course.

## Start Navigation

Use the following instructions to begin navigating a saved waypoint, route, or track. To start navigating a new track, see the section *Create New Tracks*.

### Navigate a Saved Waypoint, Route, or Track

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Waypoints, Routes, or Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Select the saved waypoint, route, or track. Tap Navigate.

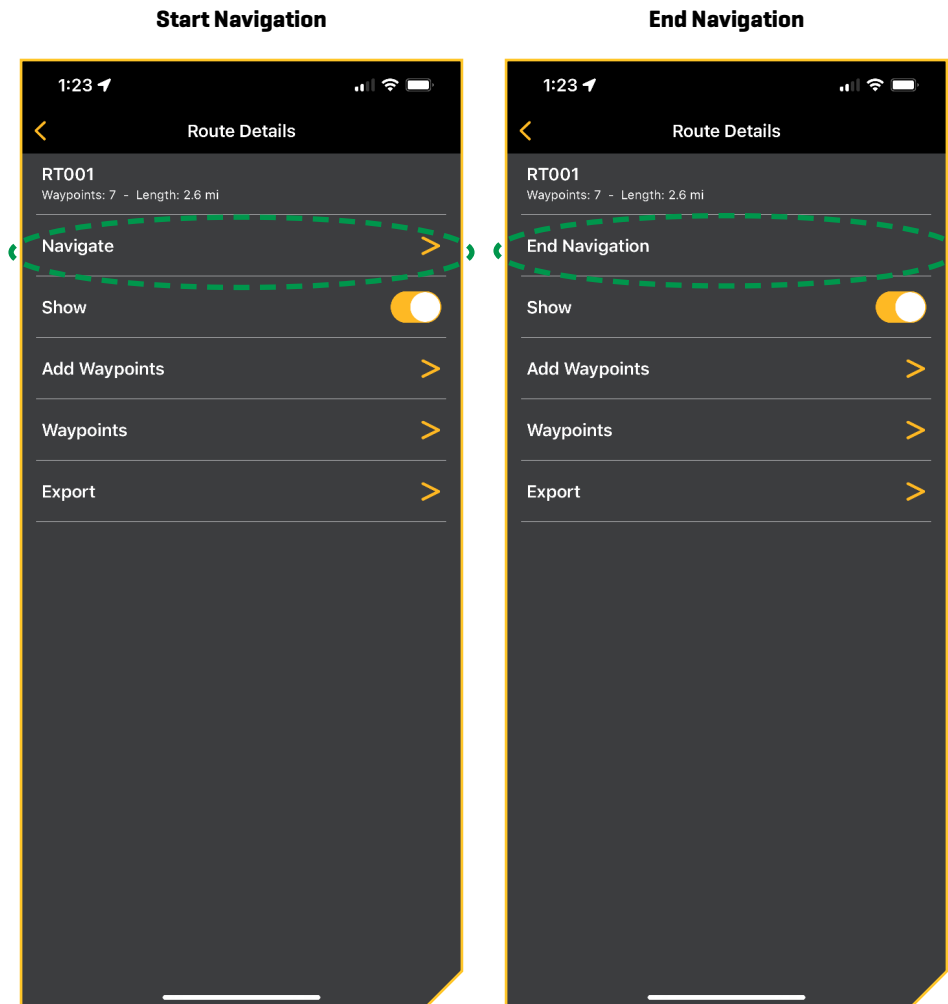
**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon next to a saved waypoint, route, or track. Tap Navigate.

## End Navigation

Use the following instructions to stop navigating.

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the Main menu, and select the Waypoints, Routes, or Tracks tab.
2. **Apple iOS:** Select the saved waypoint, route, or track. Tap End Navigate.

**Google Android:** Tap the More Options icon next to a saved waypoint, route, or track. Tap End Navigate.



# EXPORTING NAVIGATION DATA

Use the following instructions to export navigation data [waypoints, routes, and tracks] using the One-Boat Network App. Navigation data is saved as .GPX files. You can export these files via e-mail, save to your cloud storage, or use an application that is compatible with .GPX files.

Use HumminbirdPC to manage your Humminbird navigation data. Save navigation data to SD or microSD cards to display on your Humminbird fish finder[s].

 **NOTE:** Wi-Fi or cellular data must be enabled on your mobile device to download purchased charts and share navigation data. Location Services must also be enabled for GPS tracking.

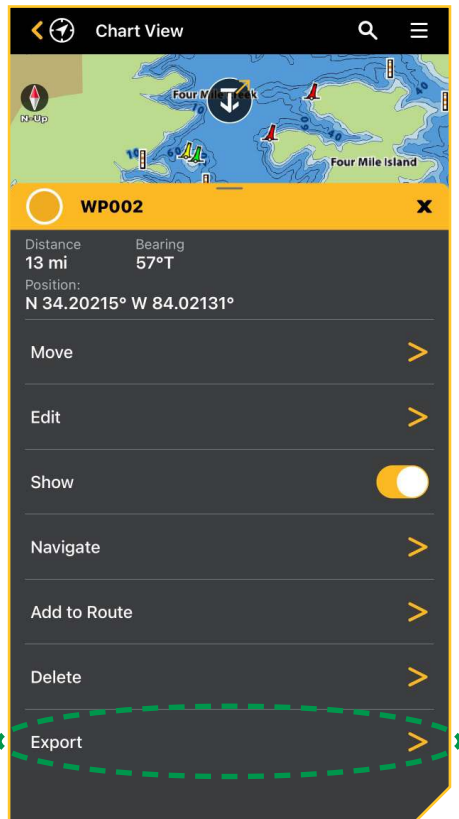
## Export Navigation Data from Chart View

1. With the chart displayed on-screen, tap a waypoint, route or track.
2. Swipe up on the waypoint/route/track information bar.
3. Tap Export.
4. Tap the application you want to use to export the selected file.
5. Follow the on-screen prompts to export the file.

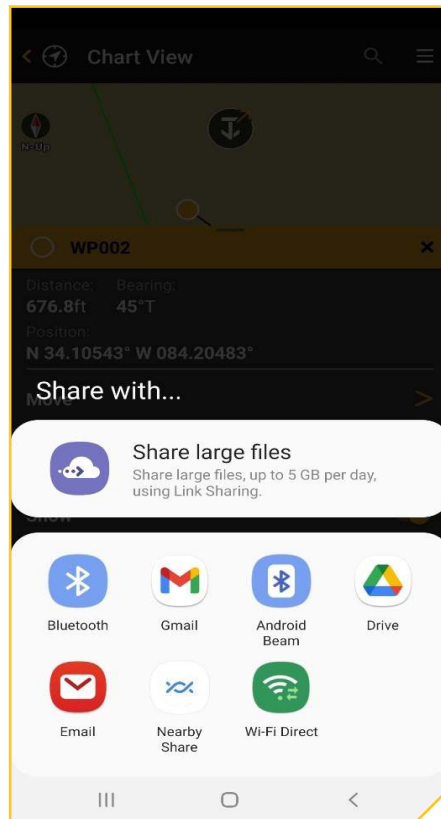
## Export Navigation Data from My Data

1. Tap the My Data menu icon from the main menu.
2. Select the type of data you would like to Export: Waypoints, Routes, or Tracks.
3. **Apple iOS:** Tap the selected item. Select Export.  
**Google Android:** Tap and hold the selected item. Select the Share icon.
4. Tap the application you want to use to export the selected file.
5. Follow the on-screen prompts to export the file.

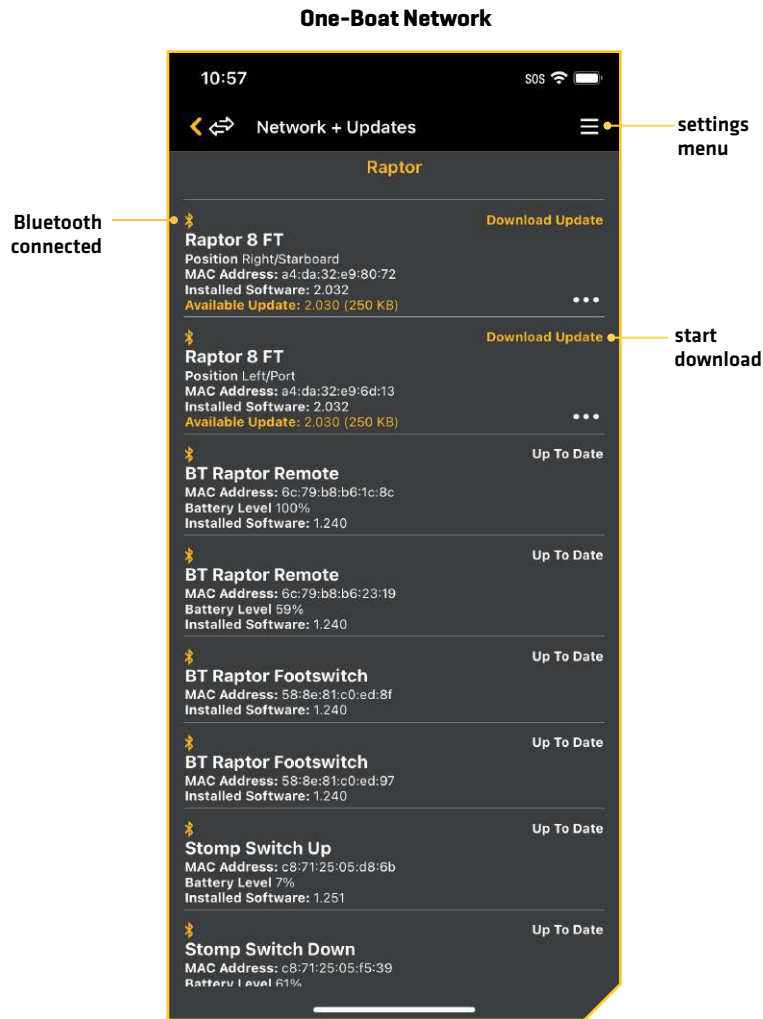


# MANAGE NETWORK & UPDATE SOFTWARE

You can use the One-Boat Network App to view everything on your One-Boat Network, review current software and download and push software updates directly to your One-Boat Network product.

 **NOTE:** Your fish finder must already be running software release 2.800 or higher for HELIX Series or 4.130 or higher for APEX/SOLIX Series to support this feature.


 **NOTE:** You must first download the One-Boat Network App and pair your Minn Kota and Humminbird compatible products.



## Update Software

### Update Humminbird Software

1. Open the One-Boat Network App on your mobile device.
2. Tap Network + Updates.
3. Tap Download Update next to the Humminbird device you want to update. The download progress is displayed on the screen. You can also tap More Options icon [...] next to the device you want to update, and then tap Download Update. Use this menu to pause or cancel the download [Apple iOS only].

 **NOTE:** Your update may take several minutes to download. You may close the app while you wait for the download to complete.

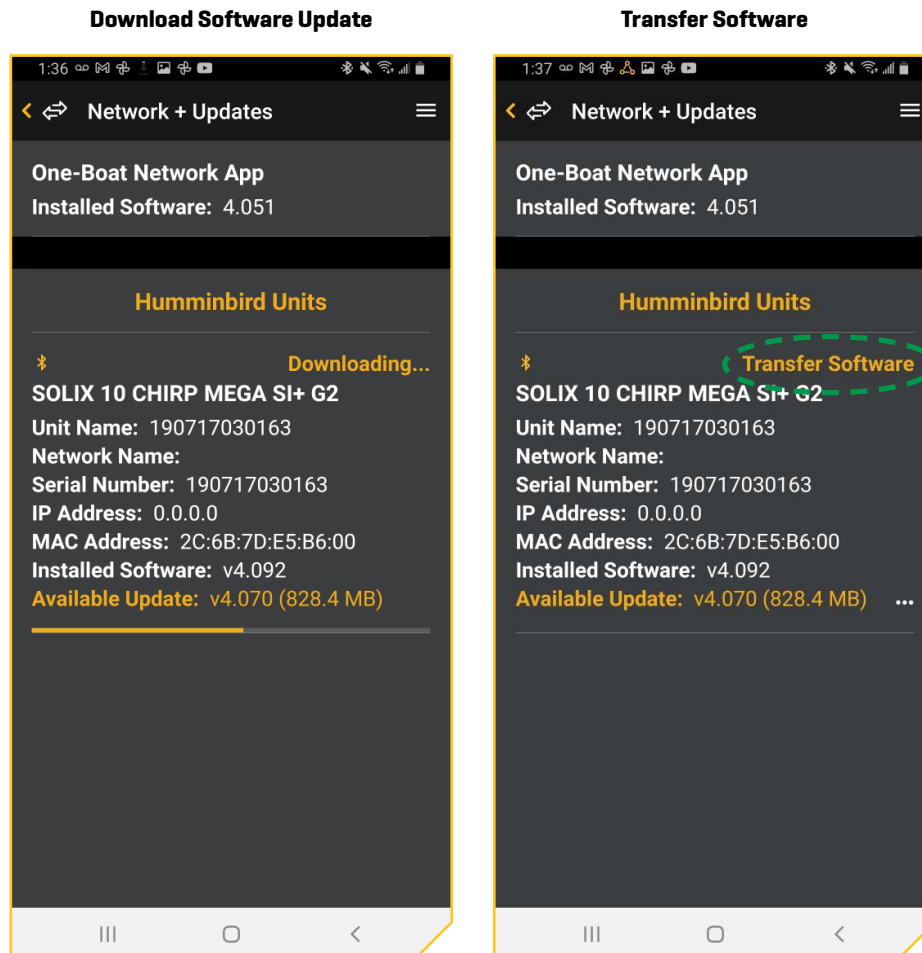
4. Tap Transfer Software next to the selected device once the download is complete. You can also tap the More Options icon [...] again, and then tap Transfer Software or Delete Software.

5. Confirm the estimated transfer time.
6. Tap the radial button to select where to upload the software update [internal storage, SD card 1, or SD slot 2].



**NOTE:** You cannot download software updates to an SD or microSD card with LakeMaster or CoastMaster charts saved to it.

7. Tap Start Transfer (Apple iOS) or Transfer (Google Android).  
The upload progress is displayed under the selected unit in the One-Boat Network App and in the System Status view on the fish finder.
8. Follow the on-screen prompts on the fish finder to complete the software installation.



## Update Accessory Software

1. Open the One-Boat Network App on your mobile device.
2. Tap Network + Updates.
3. Tap Download Update next to the device you want to update. The download progress is displayed on the screen.
4. Tap Transfer Software next to the selected device once the download is complete. The device will power cycle once complete.

## Automatically Update Software

You can set you One-Boat Network App to automatically download any new updates when your mobile device is connected to WiFi.







1. Open the One-Boat Network App on your mobile device.
2. Tap Network + Updates.
3. Tap the Settings icon.
4. Tap to turn Auto Download On Wi-Fi on.

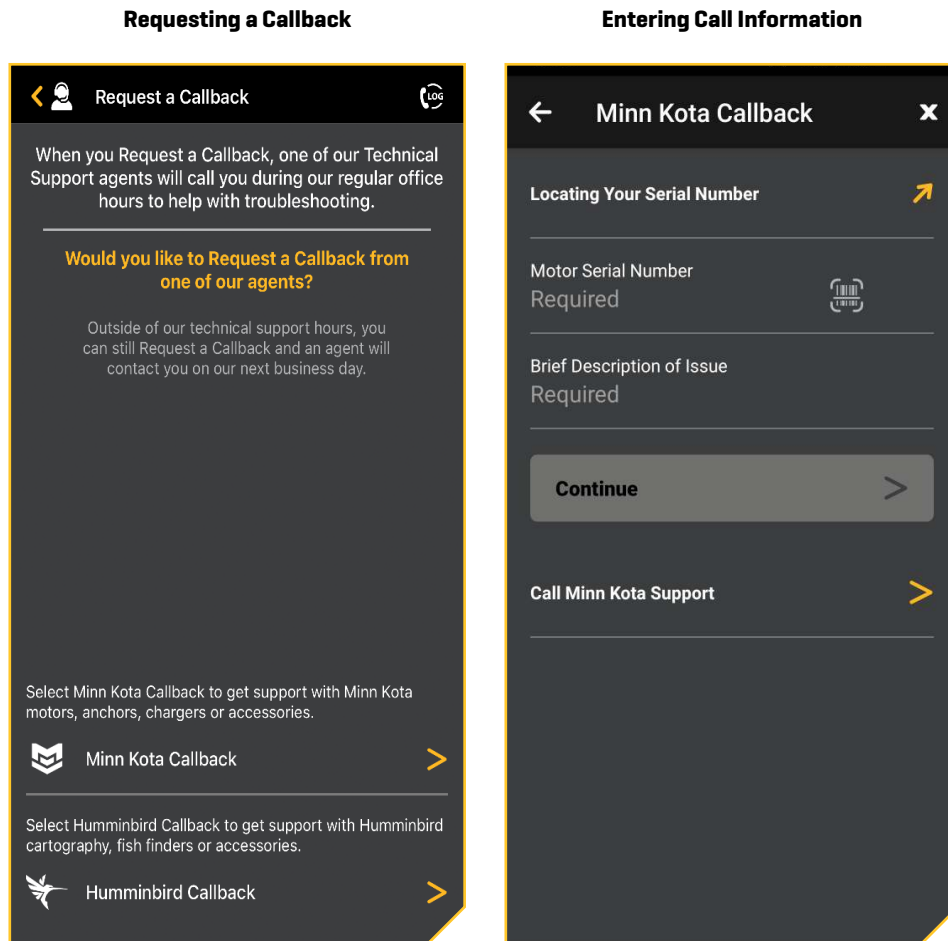
